I am proud to report that 35 of the 38 schools in Ward 19 are certified ECO Schools. How did they achieve this? Each has satisfied the criteria as set out in the Certification Guide and Planner, using a special toolkit that leads the school through exercises and studies in the following categories: Foster Leadership and Teamwork Enerav Conservation Waste Minimization Vibrant School Grounds Student Achievement through Ecological Literacy Healthy, Safe and Caring School Communities. Two of our schools, Bellmere P.S. and Cedarbrae C.I., will serve as demonstration schools in the coming school year and will share best practices in organizing and running an ECO Schools Program.
