Principal's Message:

On February 11th, you will be receiving your child's report card. These Elementary Provincial Report Cards are written for all students in grades 1-6. This term's report cards will continue to communicate your child's strengths, needs and next steps as it relates to achievement of the curriculum expectations for each subject area as well as their achievement of the learning skills. Junior Kindergarten students are scheduled to receive a summary report at this time. This summary is a means of communicating to parents/guardians a profile of their child's interests, strengths, development and learning. In addition, teachers may be requesting parent conferences for some students. Parent/Teacher Conferences may occur during the week of February 10th at scheduled times. Regardless of whether or not an interview has been scheduled to discuss your child's progress, parents may request a Parent/Teacher Conference.

Page 3 and 4 of the report card provides parents/guardians and the student with an opportunity to comment on student achievement, goals and home support. The response form links formal reporting to the process of assessment, reporting and communication about the student's learning that continues throughout the year.

We look forward to seeing you at our upcoming FSA Meeting on February 18th at 7:30pm. Please mark your calendars and join us for a very important Social Media Presentation on Wednesday, February 19th at 6:30-8:00pm. Finally, we are very excited to welcome Mosaic Artist, Chantal LeBlanc, who will be working with all students from JK-Grade 6 on three very special mosaics that represent Armour Heights' core beliefs and values: Education, Family and Social Responsibility (as decided by our students).

Learning is a partnership and we look forward to continued success in term two.

Weather Watch

Making the Best of Winter Weather at Armour

We are often asked how we decide whether it's too cold to allow our students out in the schoolyard for recess.

Fresh air and exercise are important for children. It keeps them physically fit, and helps them stay alert all through the school day. Parents can help by making sure their children come to school prepared to spend time outdoors. Hats, mitts, boots and a warm jacket are important to keep students comfortable during lunch and recess.

But extreme cold can be dangerous, and parents want to know that their children will be safe. When the temperature is predicted to drop below -15C, the City of Toronto may declare a cold weather alert. We are very sensitive to the needs of our students and pay close attention to the weather, especially when the windchill is below -20 C.


The TDSB Severe Weather Protocol is flexible, so that every principal can make a decision that meets the needs of his or her school. It sets guidelines for when to allow students outside for recess, when to make outdoor breaks shorter, and when to keep students inside altogether.

Canadian winters can be wonderful but when the weather is cold, school staff keep one eye on the thermometer and the other on the needs of our students – a perfect balance of fun and safety.

Student Safety

Please ensure that your child does not enter the school before the entry bell at 8:45am. The school yard is supervised from 8:30-8:45am, but we do not have supervision scheduled in the hallways or classrooms before 8:45am. Primary students (Grades 1-3) are to use their designated doors (1 and 5) and Junior students (Grades 4-6) are to enter through door 4. Kindergarten students are to enter through the doors closest to their classrooms in order to ensure a safe transition at entry (8:45am/ 12:35pm). In cases of extreme cold, we will have staff supervisors greeting students at the entry doors allowing them to enter supervised areas. We kindly ask that parents/ guardians encourage independence, but if you do need to enter the school, please start your visit in the office to sign in.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping keep our students safe and minimizing the amount of traffic inside the building.
