We continue to make every effort to clear snow from paths and driveways. The safety of our students is our foremost priority and we will continue to monitor the conditions in order to make decisions for outdoor play in the interest of student and community safety.

EQAO's Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division, is taken by students in Grade 3 and tests the literacy and math skills The Ontario Curriculum expects them to have gained up to the end of Grade 3. The Junior-division assessment tests the reading, writing and math skills that students are expected to have gained up to the end of Grade 6.

All partners in the education system in Ontario utilize the information from EQAO tests in order to improve student learning and achievement.

- Students in grade 3 will be writing EQAO during the week of May 26th
- Students in grade 6 will be writing EQAO during the week of June 2nd

Please try to avoid planning appointments and/ or trips during this time.

Our objective is to have Armour Heights students embark on this experience with confidence and to utilize a variety of strategies to help them succeed.

Community Safety

One of the best parts of living in our community is the variety of activities we can enjoy in our parks and public spaces all year round. With spring around the corner and the days getting longer, students may be spending more time outside. This is a good time to remind everyone to take extra care in enjoying all the outdoors can offer.

As you know, we are fortunate to have a number of safety measures, programs, and policies that contribute to a safe and caring school. However, most incidents happen away from school and outside school hours. All parents, students and staff are reminded of the need to be aware and alert at all times, even in the most ordinary and everyday routines. Our staff regularly speak to students about how to stay safe. I know that you too will want to help ensure our community is as safe as possible. Here are some tips that you may find helpful when discussing safety with your child:

- travel with at least one other person whenever possible
- avoid taking shortcuts through parks and fields and walk in well-lit, welltravelled areas
- keep valuables such as cell phones, expensive jewelry, money, laptops and personal music devices (ipod, MP3 Players) out of sight as much as possible when in public places
- be aware of suspicious behaviour; if approached, try to remember what the person or car looked like so it can be reported to a teacher, Principal, parents or the police if necessary (plate numbers can be written in the dirt or snow if nothing else is available).

Parents can also help by keeping school contact information up-to-date, including cell and business numbers. It's important for our staff to have this information to know who to contact in cases of emergencies.

Working together, we can make our community safer for our children.
