Last Friday, on our scheduled professional development day, we as a staff community began our first learning journey. As a school, we have begun to focus on the very important skill of self-regulation. Many of you will know that self-regulation is a learning skill evaluated in every provincial report card, and can be defined as the ability to monitor, maintain and change the level of alertness so that it is appropriate to a situation or task. Next week, staff will continue to delve into their understanding of self-regulation, however, starting a week Monday, and moving forward, every Monday, classes will participate in Self –Regulation Mondays, where all teachers will teach the same specific lesson with the same learning goal. The focus of the lesson will continue to be reviewed and reinforced for the remainder of the week in all classes and school activities. As a school, we will be highlighting the founding ideas of Dr. Stuart Shanker's book **Calm, Alert and Learning**, while focusing on the scaffolded lessons planned out by the Alert Programme (Kindergarten and Primary students, and the **Zones of Regulation** Programme (Junior students),

Specifically from now until the end of December, we as a school will be focusing in the first stages of the programmes:

-Students will learn the engine words (high, just right or low), or the zone colours (blue yellow, green, red), and the feelings and behaviours associated with each;

-Adults will label their own engine speeds or zones;

-Students will develop an awareness of the feel of their own engine speeds (zones), using the adult's labels as a guide;

-Students will learn to identify and label their own levels (zones) for themselves in a variety of different environments.

Stay tuned for more information on our school learning on self-regulation in the weeks and months to come.

OPAL : We Need Your Junk

Last year, we developed a partnership with Earth Day Canada and launched a pilot project to bring **Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL)** to Blake Street PS. Working together as a learning community (teachers, parents, administrators, daycare staff...) we continue to develop a play

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implementation plan for outdoor time. The children will engage in self-directed play with **loose parts** (tools, cardboard boxes and tubes, spare tires, fabric, rope, water, hay, logs, etc.), boosting their sense of agency and creating a more inclusive and reciprocal social environment.

The idea of playing with scrap materials isn't new. In fact, we have probably all done it before! In play, loose parts are any materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, taken apart and put back together in multiple ways. They are materials with no specific set of directions that can be used alone or combined with other materials to inspire building, fort making, imaginative worlds and active play.

As you may be aware, we have a school age OPAL shed on the south east corner of our field, and we need to fill it up. We are currently collecting loose parts for our OPAL program. If you have something old, broken, or taking up space in your home, we want you to think of the potential for loose parts play before you throw it away! Items may include: milk crates, art easels, car tires, wheels, large empty spools, plastic piping, old kitchen items, old electronics, cardboard boxes, landscaping scraps like wooden stump. Any collected items can be dropped off in the office or to your child's teacher.
