We are pleased to announce that the Model Schools Paediatric Clinic at Sprucecourt Public School is in operation for the 2017/18 school year. As well as serving the Sprucecourt PS community, <u>the clinic is</u> <u>available to our school and our</u> <u>students.</u> The clinic operates Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays during the school year.

The school-based health clinic at Sprucecourt is staffed by Family Physicians, Pediatricians and developmental Pediatricians on different days. Appointments are available for TDSB students and/or their siblings (ages 0-12). In addition to episodic health concerns, the clinic is also available for:
