This week began our self -regulation focused lessons. Students in grades 1-3 were introduced to the concept that our bodies are like speedometers, with three different settings: low, just right and high. Students have spent the week learning about the leaning of different engine speeds, and beginning to reflect on the influence of their engine speeds on their behaviours and readiness to learn, as well as the engine speeds of their classmates. Junior students have been learning about their zones of regulation, which include Blue (low state), green (just right state) yellow zone (getting riled up) and red (full blown). They too are learning to self- identify their zone throughout the day. This weekend, I encourage you to talk with your child about their self-regulation learning and begin to use some of this language yourself as you model your own states of regulation.

Our kindergarten play ground is moving along beautifully, as the photos show. We anticipate near completion by this time next week, and we look forward to opening up for our students and our community.

Today we have added some new signage to the doors of our staff washrooms, with more signs will be added next week to the washroom doors in the kindergarten rooms. These all gender washroom signs show our commitment to making sure our school is inclusive and welcoming to all. In the coming week, classrooms will be discussing in developmentally appropriate ways the meaning of these signs, and what they represent in a broader context.



Next Tuesday is Halloween, and we will be having a full school Halloween parade in the afternoon. There are three guidelines we ask you to think about for Tuesday's school wide festivities. For those students who will be wearing a costume, we ask that:

-students do not come in costume (except kindergarten students) in the morning as this takes away from the learning of the morning session. Students have the choice to be signed out for lunch and change at home, or they can change at school after lunch from 12:30 – 1:50;

-that costume choice be appropriate and do not reinforce cultural stereotypes;

-while masks are allowed, we ask that all weapons incorporated into a costume stay at home.

If you have not yet brought in your food item donations to support Eastview Neighbourhood Community Food Bank, please do so.

Finally, we had a school wide lice check today. It is important to be pro-active and to regularly look at your child's head for the signs of lice. Lice are tiny, wingless insects that move quickly and are difficult to see. They cannot jump or fly, and are 1-2 mm long and are greyish brown in colour. Before lice turn into insects, they can be found on the hair as a nit (eggs). Nits are hard to see and can often be confused with dandruff. They are yellow to white in colour, and attach themselves a strand of hair, and will not fall away from the hair if you shake the hair or blow on it. Nits are stuck to the hair, and can only be taken off the hair piece by pulling it off. The nits, if not treated and pulled off, hatch and turn into live lice. Because of this it important to not only treat the hair with special lice shampoo but to also check the head and pull the nits off.
