Looking Forward

As the activities at this time of year are ramping up and the school year is winding down, it can be a very stressful time for students and their families. It is the time of year where smooth transitions become very important in order to provide effective supports and optimal future success. There is no question about it – successful transitions begin with excellent school/ home communication and collaboration. One of the most important components of a good school is the partnership between school, parents, and the community, who work together for the best interest of children.

Parents are the single most important variable in a child's schooling. Parents model both a silent and spoken language in front of their children daily, so effective and positive conversations about transitions are very important. In addition, teachers/school also play a critical role supporting transitions. Teachers have the unique opportunity to support students' academic and social development at all levels of schooling. Therefore, through this secure relationship, students can reduce their anxiety and self-doubt that change may bring about. With families and school working together towards a common goal, where children have the security of understanding their environment, and are guided positively through major changes, their sense of self and their changing environment becomes better understood. This is essential for reducing potential anxiety or fear.

Childhood is a special time of learning, exploring and growing. Children need to be provided a secure pathway to explore their world and experience the joy of discovery. As Alexander Graham Bell so aptly stated, "When one door closes, another opens; but we often look so long and so regretfully upon the closed door that we do not see the one which has opened for us." In our collaboration to support children during transitions, we need to positively model, that with support, guidance, patience, and optimism, children can embrace their changing world and take advantage of new opportunities with greater confidence and understanding.

Equity and Positive Spaces at Bowmore

On April 17th, several Bowmore teachers attended a professional development workshop on Positive Spaces facilitated by Cristina Guerrero, an instructional leader in the Equity and Inclusive Schools Department at the TDSB. The workshop focused on a variety of equity topics including: culturally relevant and responsive pedagogy (CRRP), gender equity, religious accommodations, anti-homophobia and Positive Spaces in schools.

As part of Ontario's Equity and Inclusive Education Strategy, the TDSB has undertaken a *Positive Spaces Initiative*. The goal is to make all TDSB workplaces and schools safe, inclusive and welcoming places.

Positive Spaces will be identified by a Positive Spaces poster and will be accessible to the whole school community. One staff member will be trained as a Positive Spaces Representative. The *Positive Spaces* representative will offer support by listening, having resources available, and referring to community resources where available.


