Did you know...




DIWALI



FRENCH IMMERSION Senior Kindergarten Application (ON LINE APPLICATION ONLY)

French Immersion programs are designed for students who do not speak French at home. Early Immersion begins in **Senior Kindergarten**, and provides the maximum French language experience available in TDSB.

All instruction and activities are conducted in French until the end of Grade 3 although some specialist subjects such as Physical and Health Education, Music, etc. may be taught in English. English begins in Grade 4 for about one hour per day and increases in Gr 5 and 6.

After Grade 8, students continue the French Immersion program at designated high schools. Students who successfully complete the high school program will receive a Certificate of Bilingual Studies in French Immersion.

Transportation applications are available only for students living 1.6 km or more from Brimwood Blvd. P.S.

KINDERGARTEN TIPS

Show your child that YOU read, write, and use math in your everyday life.

FREE DENTAL SCREENING AT BRIMWOOD

Toronto Public Health provides dental programs to children from JK to Grade 8. To identify children with oral health problems, a screening program is offered to students in accordance with the Ontario Ministry of Health requirements for mandatory health programs. The screening is an assessment by a dental hygienist using sterilized instruments. The dental hygienist will assess the need for topical fluoride, scaling, sealant and any other obvious dental needs. *Please be advised that this does not replace the dental examination done by a dentist.*

The dental screening dates for Brimwood will be on November 29, 30 and December 5, 6

After the screening, <u>only</u> parents whose children are identified as requiring dental services will be <u>notified</u>. A note to that effect will be sent home with your child/ren for your information and action. You may also receive a phone call from Toronto Public Health dental staff to assist you in accessing care.

If you do not wish your child/ren to be screened, please send a note to the school.
