





Students participate in mock trials and model UN competitions against other schools in Ontario.










Lawyers from our partner firm also mentor LAWS students and they are even offered paid summer internships at a variety of law firms in the city!



**January 9, 2023** - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application opens

**January 27, 2023 (4:00 p.m.)** - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application closes





### **Out-of-Area Admission**

- Families may select up to two (2) schools and <u>must</u> <u>rank</u> their choices.
  - If the student is selected for their first choice, they will not be considered for their second choice.
- The selection process is random, all email communication and responses are managed centrally
- Families will be contacted via email.
- Please do not contact schools directly for results or updates.



### **Acceptances Timelines**

**February 8, 2023** - Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. **Offers expire February 14, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.** 

**February 15, 2023** - Second round of Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. **Offers expire February 21, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.** 

**February 22, 2023** - Any final offers will be sent. All waitlists expire on this date. **Offers Expire on February 24, 2023.** 

**February 27, 2023** - TDSB students must finalize their acceptance by completing and submitting the corresponding course selection for the accepted school in myBlueprint

- Applications cannot be changed after they are submitted.
   Please ensure your application is submitted no later than Friday, November 25 at 4:00 p.m.



### **Acceptances: Timelines**

The random selection process will occur centrally and all communication will come from the Board. Please do not contact schools directly for selection results.

- **December 8, 2022** Acceptances and waitlist status will be <u>sent centrally</u>, via email to all applicants. **Offers expire December 14, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.**
- December 15, 2022 Second round of Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. Offers expire December 21, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.
- **February 22, 2023** Late offers will be made should spaces become available up until this date (Secondary).
