The wet weather also forced a great deal of indoor practice for the soccer teams this spring at Churchill. The boys' team played their tournament on May 30th with all of the team members enjoying playing three games of soccer during the day. The girls' team held their tournament on June 7th.

<u>Entry Doors</u>: Please note that the school entry doors from the east parking lot are for child care families only, during the hours of the child care only. If your child is late to school or if you are visiting or picking up your child during school hours, please make sure to come through the doors from the main school yard or the front doors on Churchill Ave. Please also note that these sets of doors are not to be used as a short-cut between the school yard and Churchill Ave. We need to ensure the safety and security of the school. Thank you for your cooperation.

<u>Parking</u>: All cars parked in areas other than parking spots are not to be left without a driver. **Emergency vehicles** must always have access to the lots and other cars must always be able to leave their spots. Please remember that parking is available on the streets around Churchill PS. **At NO TIME shall a child be let out of a car while on Senlac Ave.**

<u>Supervision Before and After School</u>: Teacher supervisors are in the school yard from 8:40 a.m. and until 3:45 p.m. However, kindergarten students must ALWAYS be supervised by caregivers. It is also expected that caregivers *directly* supervise their children beginning at 3:30 every day in all areas including the play structure, field, tarmac, and parking lots.

Understanding Your Child's Reports

A Parent's Guide to Kindergarten Communication of Learning: Initial Observations and the Kindergarten Communication of Learning


The Ontario government is introducing new provincial reports in Kindergarten. School boards will start phasing in these new reports in the 2016-2017 school year, and then in 2017-18, all parents¹ of children in Kindergarten will receive the following reports:

- Fall Initial Observations Report
- Winter and Spring Communication of Learning Reports

These three reports will help parents understand their child's progress during the course of the school year. They are part of Ontario's updated policy on the assessment, evaluation and reporting of children's learning in kindergarten, found in *Growing Success – The Kindergarten Addendum 2016*.

This guide has information to help you understand:

- the format of the new reports
- how you can support your child's learning through ongoing communication with their educators.



1. The word 'parents' is used in this guide to refer collectively to a parent, guardian, caregiver, and/or close family member who is responsible for raising the child.

Fundamental Principles of Assessment and Evaluation

The purpose of these reports is to foster your child's learning and development, and to support your child in becoming an independent learner.

Just like educators teaching Grade 1-12 students, kindergarten educators use assessment and evaluation practices and procedures that are designed to offer feedback that is clear, meaningful and timely.

Your Role as a Parent

Children do better at school when their families are involved. Families, educators and caregivers who work as partners enjoy a meaningful relationship and share valuable communication that can support a child's sense of trust, belonging, well-being and success as a learner.

The kindergarten reports offer:

- clear, meaningful information about your child's learning
- three formal opportunities to hear from your child's educators throughout the school year
- a basis for supporting ongoing communication between home and school.



The Initial Observations Report

The Initial Observations Report will be sent home between late October and November. The purpose of this report is to provide an overview of observations of your child's learning since the start of the school year and early evidence of growth in learning in relation to the overall expectations of *The Kindergarten Program (2016)*.

This first formal report of the school year can help educators and families develop a positive relationship as partners who share the goal of helping children to be successful. It will give you information about appropriate next steps to support your child's learning both at school and at home.

The Communication of Learning Report

This report is organized according to the four parts or "frames" of the 2016 Kindergarten Program:

- 1. Belonging and Contributing
- 2. Self-Regulation and Well-Being
- Demonstrating Literacy and Mathematics Behaviours, and
- 4. Problem Solving and Innovating.

These frames reflect the integrated way in which learning happens through children's play and inquiry in kindergarten.

For Catholic schools, the report includes a section where comments about "Religious and Family Life Education" learning are recorded.

For each of the frames, educators will add personalised comments about your child that are clear and easy to understand.

These comments:

- will tell you about your child's "key learning" and "growth in learning"
- can provide specific examples
- may include next steps to support your child's learning at school and at home.

Educators will indicate if the expectations for your child need to be modified by checking the ESL (English as a Second Language) box or the IEP (Individual Education Plan) box.

Definitions of Terms used in Kindergarten Reports

The following section explains some of the terms that will be used in your child's reports.

Key Learning

Key learning is the most significant learning for your child leading up to the time each report is completed. The most important learning for your child may not be the same as for another child. Educators describe the most important and significant skills, interests and/or knowledge your child has demonstrated based on the overall expectations in the *Kindergarten Program* (2016).

Growth in Learning

Learning means more than just knowing the facts. Children can demonstrate their new learning by communicating and applying what they have learned in different contexts. When educators

evaluate Growth in Learning and record it on your child's report they consider:

- the ways in which your child learns
- how they are developing, and
- the direction their learning is taking.

Growth in Learning can refer to one or more of the following:

- movement from a simpler to a more complex stage of development
- an increase in skills or scope of knowledge
- an increase in learning related to kindergarten "frames" such as belonging, contributing, self-regulation, well-being, math, literacy, problem solving and innovation.

Next Steps in Learning

Educators use their observations of how your child is learning in relation to the Program expectations to determine appropriate learning goals for your child.

These "Next Steps" are included in each of the Kindergarten reports that you will receive. There may also be ongoing and less formal communication about your child's next steps at other times.

Educators will work with your child to set personalized learning goals and support your child's progress in the classroom. You can also have a conversation with your child's educators about ways to encourage your child's progress at home.

The Role of Educators

Communication with Parents

Ongoing, clear and meaningful communication between parents, their child and the educator team is vital to a child's growth in learning. You will hear from your child's educators regularly throughout the school year. In addition to written documents, other types of communication might include:

- school or class blogs or websites
- photos and/or children's work
- discussions between a parent and educator or between a parent, child and educator

- sharing the child's portfolio with you
- informal communication through phone calls, notes, letters or emails.

The educators and the principal in your child's school will be able to provide more information about what kinds of communication you can expect to receive.

Evaluation and Observation

Educators observe your child work with other children, adults and materials. They see and hear what children create, how they work with materials (e.g., paint, blocks, crayons, books, etc.), as they show their thinking and learning. Educators have many conversations with your child to understand how your child is making sense of their experiences. They also observe how children problem solve, use social skills, and how they understand their own thoughts and feelings. Educators use these conversations and observations in gathering as much information as possible about your child's learning.

Educators analyse this information to evaluate your child's key learning and growth in learning in relation to the overall expectations of the Kindergarten Program. This evalution is reflected in the comments they write on the Communication of Learning report.

Special Education and Section Programs

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Toronto District School Board is exploring ways of transitioning towards greater inclusion in Special Education programs. Providing children with special education needs with the instructional support and services they need within the regular program in neighbourhood schools, will improve achievement and well-being for all students.

We know that inclusion isn't just about keeping students in the regular classroom. It's about meeting the needs of all students in a class. Collaboration between regular classroom teachers and special education staff will help us find the most effective ways to meet the needs of every student.

As part of this transition, we have reviewed the Home School Program (HSP). Currently, many students in Grades 1 to 8 receive a half-day of special education instruction in the HSP. In most schools, this support is provided apart from the regular program. A number of schools have already chosen to support these students in the regular classroom with great success.

We believe we can do a better job for all students in the regular class with appropriate resources. Beginning in the 2017-2018 school year, we will start phasing out primary grade placements in HSP, beginning with no Grade 1 students admitted to the program. In the 2018-2019 school year, HSP will only support students in Grades 4 to 8. Teachers and educational assistants who currently assist HSP students will continue to do so, but schools will have greater flexibility in deciding how to deliver HSP support. Please see questions and answers below for more details.

Transitioning towards inclusion will require collaboration and the creation of positive and welcoming classroom environments that will enable all students to succeed.

SPECIAL EDUCATION - HOME SCHOOL PROGRAM

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What might HSP look like at my child's school next year?

Students admitted to HSP may spend part of their day learning in a regular classroom and part separately with the HSP teacher. Sometimes, they may receive support individually while other times, it may take place in small groups. Some students currently assisted in a withdrawal setting may instead receive all of their support in their regular grade classrooms. It will vary from student to student, based on their learning needs.

2. If my child entering Grade 1 in September has special education needs, what can I expect in terms of support?

On a regular basis, regular classroom teachers make adjustments to their teaching and assessment methods to meet a wide variety of student learning needs in the classroom. Grade 1 students, who might previously have been admitted to HSP for special education instruction, will instead receive support in their regular classroom. Close collaboration between the classroom teacher, school-based special education staff and special education consultants will assist teachers in planning and delivering this "differentiated instruction".

3. If my child was in HSP this year, what will happen next year?

Students in Grades 2 to 8 will continue to receive HSP support in the ways described above. Since one of our goals is greater flexibility for schools to respond to the needs of their students, the delivery model will vary from school to school. Each school principal can provide specific answers to how the program will be delivered in their schools.

4. How will the effectiveness of changes to HSP delivery be evaluated?

On an on-going basis, teachers are required to evaluate, monitor and report on the success of their students in meeting the Ministry of Education curriculum objectives identified in students' Individual Education Plans (IEP). Achievement data is also used as part of annual school improvement planning. Each school must address the three pillars of equity, achievement and well-being, using school-based measures and staff feedback to identify what is working well and areas that require attention. School superintendents can review school achievement data for the schools in their network and assist their school administrators in addressing identified needs. At the system level, the TDSB follows the progress of all students and of students with special education needs as a subset, through on-going analysis of achievement data in provincial report cards, progress reports and the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) assessments.

5. If I have questions or concerns, who do I contact?

As we make changes to the delivery of special education programs and services, we continue to value active and meaningful collaboration with all stakeholders. If you have additional questions, we invite you to follow the updates on our website at www.tdsb.on.ca/specialeducation. You can also contact your child's school principal for more specific information about what HSP will look like for your child. If questions or concerns remain, the principal can help you connect with the appropriate school superintendent or special education department staff.
