Tell how you made it. What did you do <i>first, second, next</i> and <i>last?</i>
7 Read to your child in your home language. Talk about the pictures. Ask what, who, where, when and why questions. Retell the story together.	8	9	10 Go swimming and have your child pretend to be different sea creatures (e.g., fish, seahorse, and whale).	11 Have your child invite a friend over to play. Use cooperative games to build turn taking (it's your/my turn).	12	13 Go for a walk and play "I spy" (e.g., I spy something round, green, etc.).
14	15 Take a ferry to Centreville Amusement Park on Toronto Island and have fun in the sun!	16	17 Act out a favourite story using your home language.	18	19	20 Plan and enjoy a picnic in the park.
21 Watch a TV show together and leave for a minute. Come back and have your child tell you what you missed.	22	23 Spend time at the library reading Franklin books. Talk about similarities and differences between the books.	24	25 Visit Harbourfront Centre to enjoy festivals, food, music, films, and kids activities.	26 Use sidewalk chalk to help your child write summer words - sun, hot, sky.	27
