The Ministry of Education is introducing new reports in Kindergarten. Teachers across Ontario will be using the new template for communicating children's learning in the Kindergarten Program. The TDSB began using these new reports in June 2017. The new reports will help parents understand their child's progress during the course of the school year.

### **Reading at Home is Important**

Reading is and always will be an important skill for students. In our modern world it is more important than ever. Children learn about the importance of reading as they watch family members use reading and writing every day. Reading with your child at home will help in all learning areas of school. Parents are asked to read with their children at home. Reading aloud to children and listening to your child read are both equally valuable in supporting reading. It helps them learn vocabulary and encourages them to read and enjoy books. Talk about the books, read together on a daily basis and make the time enjoyable.

Visit and use the local and school library with your child. Borrow books regularly and enjoy reading together!



#### **Morning Drop-off Routines**

Staff begin supervision in the school yard at 8:45 a.m. Please ensure that students do not arrive prior to 8:45 when staff are outside on duty. Staff will pick up students directly from their entry door. Parents are asked to remain outside to allow students to enter with their class. Students are learning important self-help skills which fosters independence which is an important learning skill for all students.

If your child is late, please report to the office for a late slip. We will call a student to escort your child to class. It is important that once the school day has started, parents do not enter classrooms as it can be disruptive to learning. If you need to speak to a teacher, please arrange for another time. Thank you for your cooperation as we strive to create the most effective learning environment for all students.

## **Immunizations**

Toronto Public Health has already issued two notices to parents of Grade 2, 3 and 4 students requesting updated immunization information. The immunization of School Pupils Act requires that students in our schools be suspended in situations where Public Health has not received one of the following:

- Immunization information(showing that the child has received immunizations)
- A statement of medical exemption
- A statement of conscience or religious belief

If you received letters from Public Health please ensure that you comply with the request for information by the due date to avoid suspension.
