### **Orange Shirt Day**

Orange Shirt Day is about creating a space for learning about Indigenous Peoples in Canada. Orange Shirt Day is a national movement that oficially began in 2013. It has its origins in the experience of a six year old girl names Phyllis Webstad. In 1973 she entered the St. Joseph Mission Residential School in B.C. wearing an orange shirt for her first day of school – but her shirt was taken away from her upon her arrival to school. Orange Shirt Day calls on every Canadian to wear an orange shirt in the spirit of healing and reconciliation by recognizing the issue of residential schools, honouring the survivors and victims and making an effort to ensure that **every child matters.** 

### **Terry Fox School Run 2017**

On Friday, September 29, 2017 the students at David Hornell will be taking part in the annual Terry Fox School Run. Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary year offers us the opportunity to celebrate our country and Terry at the same time in September. # **School Safety**

A number of measures are in place to ensure the safety of all students and staff, including, but not limited to: Fire Drills, Lockdown Procedures, Code of Conduct and monitoring entry to the school building. During the course of the year we will hold six fire drills and two lockdown procedure drills. The students have been informed about the protocol to be followed in each of these procedures. If you have any questions in this regard, please feel free to contact the school.

# Some other friendly reminders:

- Our parking lot is very small and just fits all of our staff members.
   Please refrain from parking in the lot when dropping off or picking up students. Please walk when possible or park on adjacent streets close to the school.
- <u>Please do not walk with children through the parking lot.</u> Please use the fenced walkway along the side or enter the school yard from the east side where there are no cars.
- Staff begin supervision in the school yard at 8:45 a.m. Please ensure that students do not arrive prior to 8:45 when staff are outside on duty. The same applies to dismissal at the end of the day. Staff are on duty until 3:35. Children who are not picked up by 3:35 will be taken inside to wait for their parent/guardian at the office.
- TDSB Security are available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. They often drive by schools to ensure that the grounds are safe during the evenings and weekends as well. # **Eco-Schools Program**

David Hornell has registered with the TDSB as an Eco-School! The EcoSchools department is part of the Sustainability Office at the TDSB. EcoSchools is a school greening program with a very broad scope covering not only what is taught, but also how we run our schools and how we design and use our schools grounds. Its central focus is supporting students and staff in learning about, caring for, and protecting the environment starting right in their own school.

EcoSchools asks us to examine the decisions we make in our schools, inside and out — from modifying practices in our classrooms, offices, and boiler rooms to designing the school ground as a place for healthy, enriched learning.

At David Hornell we have introduced our green compost bin in our lunchrooms and our goal is to introduce a waste free lunch program.

### This means that:

- Lunches should be packed in re-usable containers
- Leftover food will be disposed of in the compost bin in our lunch rooms
- Garbage will be brought back home to dispose of at home
- As a precaution, parents are encouraged to clean and disinfect all reusable containers on a nightly basis in order to prevent food-borne illnesses

Our hope is to teach our students these earth-friendly practices that they will continue to use as they grow into young adults.

#### Parent Volunteers at David Hornell

Parents and community members are encouraged to participate in volunteer activities in our schools that support programs and services and help students succeed. Here are some ways you can help in your child's classroom or school:

Reading with students who need extra help
Arranging material in the library
Supervising children on field trips
Collecting community materials for a classroom project
Participate in meetings and activities of the School Council

Parents and community members who wish to volunteer must, like all TDSB employees, complete a Police Reference Check (which will include a vulnerable sector screening) and be cleared before they can tutor/mentor in any TDSB location or participate in activities with our students.

#### \*\*Police Reference Checks\*\*

Parents who are interested in volunteering can pick up the Police Reference Check Form at the school office. Once it is complete, it needs to be returned to the school office with a certified cheque or money order for \$20 made payable to Toronto Police Services.

Police services will mail the results to your home. <u>Please bring the original to the school office</u> and we will submit it to the TDSB Police Record Check Office for processing.

Once you have completed the initial Police Check you do not have to repeat this process each year. You need to only complete the online Offence Declaration each year. Parents can get assistance with this at our school office.
