GERRY MABIN from THE MABIN SCHOOL

Gerry spoke to us about her programme Words in Motion (wordsinmotion.ca).

This programme teaches children the principles of friendship in action. Parents of children today often indulge a child's natural tendency toward self-absorption, and manners, respect, caring, and being aware of one's impact on others are lacking. Through stories, drama, and interactive games, common situations where one's behaviour has a direct effect on others are illustrated. The programme gets the children to answer questions such as: What is a friend?, How do friends treat each other?, What is helping?, How does laughing at someone make them feel? The programme leaders also want to work with parents to help them instil and reinforce positive interactions.

Leaders would come to classes in Grades 1-3 for 4-5 sessions of 45min to 1hr. The programme curriculum would tie in with the school curriculum areas of language and character development. The seeds of caring behaviour are planted, then sustained by the teacher.

The programme has been launched in Fern Av., Rose Av., Essex, Market Lane, and schools north of Kipling. Eventually, Words In Action would like to partner with half a dozen schools in Toronto, including Deer Park, do 3 major sessions annually, and track the effects with the help of the York U psychology department. The measurement of success would be an anecdotal increase in positive attitudes.

The cost is for 4 hours is \$1100 for 1 class; if 2 classes participate, additional \$400, and so on. Sue advised we will revisit this proposal at another meeting to review pricing and contributions from the TDSB under 'character education'. Gerry advised she provide us with a complementary session in June before school ends.
