  - CyberARTS courses are for students officially accepted into the program
  - IDC - Interdisciplinary courses - a student may take a maximum of 3 IDC courses, but not 2 at the same level (IDC4U1, IDC4UP)
    - note: IDC courses do not count towards compulsory credits or mandatory Groups 1, 2 or 3, but at the U/M level, they are university-bound courses*
