Activities: parachute games, face paint, sports, pet rock painting, Chalks/bubbles/hula hoops and more!

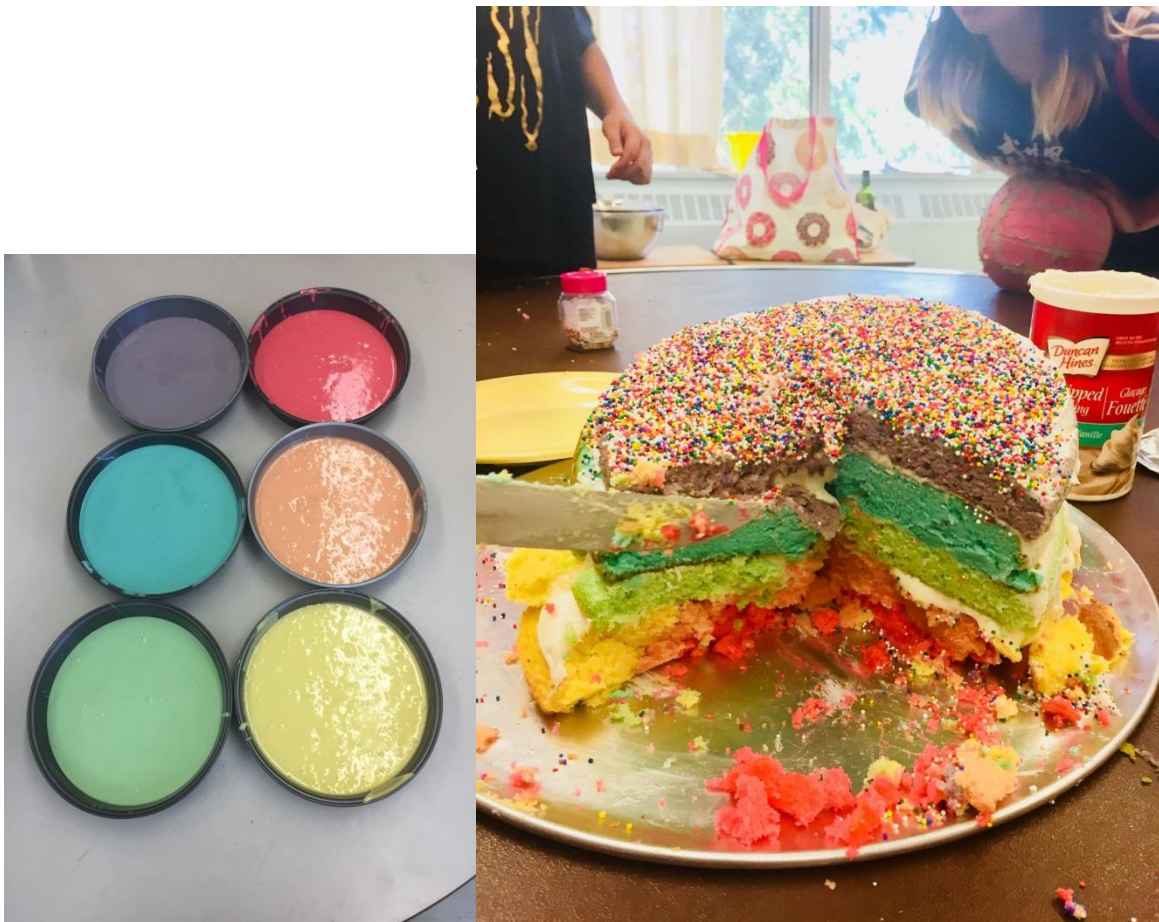
Teachers and older students will be operating various events with students moving from station to station.

Library News

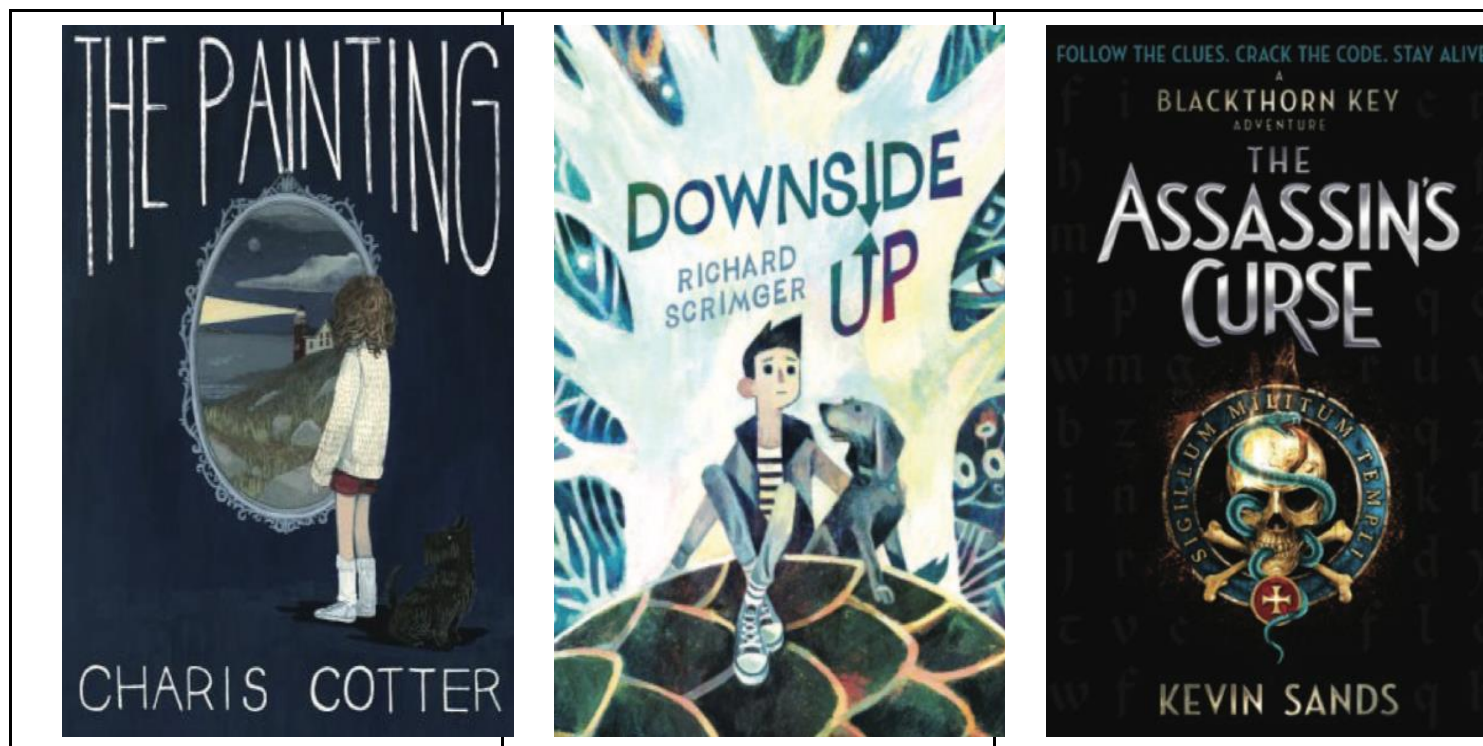

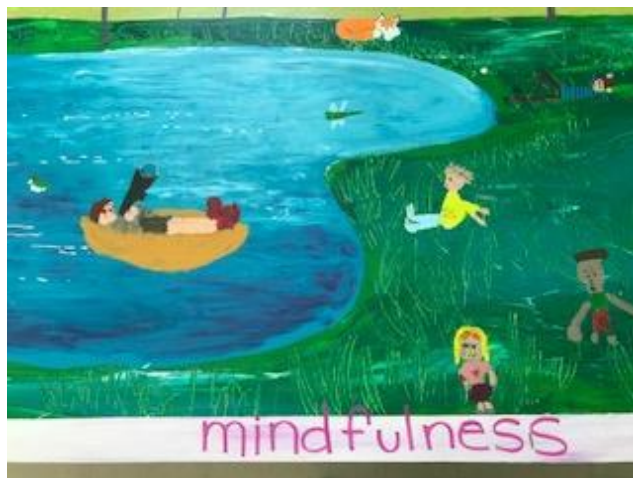

It was absolutely kablooeey.

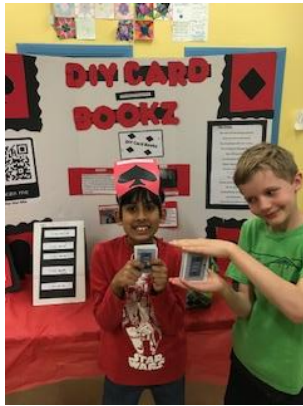
If you face obstacles

I can achieve.

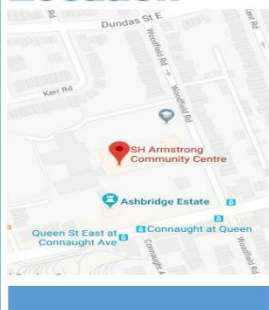
Eco School News/World Environment Day

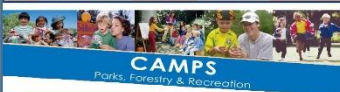
S.H. Armstrong Community Centre is located north of Queen St East, south of Woodfield. It is attached to Duke of Connaught Public School.

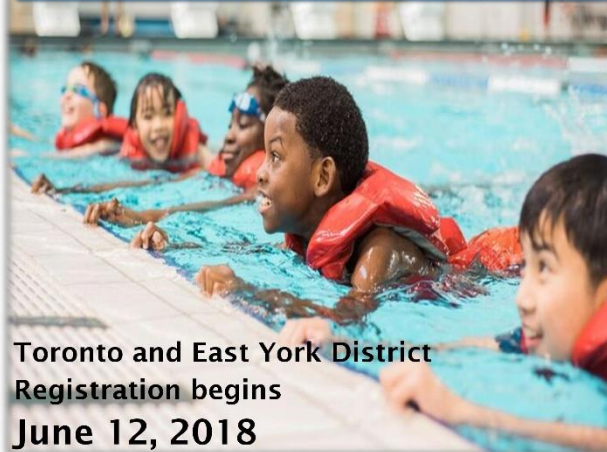
