- 2. Two pieces of identification that show your address (utility bill, rental or lease agreement,

bank statement) A driver's license is not accepted.

- 3. Child's Health Card
- 4. Child's Immunization Record
- 5. Legal Custody Document (if applicable)

Earl Beatty Now & Then



"Pupils graduated, teachers came and went, leaving with regrets. Pride, Loyalty and Fair Play were the secrets of our success, inspired by our principals – Mr. Scott, Mr. Stiver, Mr. Knott, and Mr. Bruchell.

We had many amusing events at Earl Beatty. Do any of you remember the morning the snake, a rattler escaped from Mr. Lloyd Dennis' science room? It rattled its way out into the upper hall. Mr. Dennis was down at the office telephone at the time. The excited class expected me to rescue it, but I know rattlers! It slipped into an air vent near the floor and disappeared.

Or can anyone recall, some years earlier, the first car a teacher bought? It was a shiny black model "T" Ford. Two of his prankster friends filled a pail with water, took a large brown paper bag and went up the third floor room just above the main entrance steps. When the motorist came out, the water was poured into the bag and the bag dropped out of the top window just as the car moved away. Of course, the bag burst with a cannon ball crash. The motorist stopped his car, inspected the four tired, the engine, and looking under the car, saw the water and burst bag. He also heard the peals of laughter from the pranksters.

Of these two men (pranksters), when the Second World War broke out, one was on leave of absence in England, studying at London University. He manned a motor launch making continual trips across the English Channel bring boatloads of the injured back from home from the seashore of Dunkirk.

The other prankster joined the Air Force, became a Flight Lieutenant and Squadron Leader. Another of our men did the same. They returned home together. The squadron marched into Varsity Stadium where they disbanded, cheering and greeted by Earl Beatty residents. "
