Kindergarten Registration

February is Kindergarten Registration Month!

At the Toronto District School Board, our elementary schools offer Full-Day Kindergarten. Our educators recognize that children come to school with diverse backgrounds and rich experiences. Our Kindergarten programs will build upon these experiences and support your child to learn, grow, and succeed. At the TDSB, we believe our youngest learners benefit from engaging in a variety of rich and authentic learning, both indoors and outdoors. Our classroom programs are designed to bring The Kindergarten Program 2016 to life by providing children opportunities to learn through play, inquiry, and exploration. Throughout the two-year Kindergarten program, classroom educators support the children in developing their sense of belonging, well-being, and problem solving skills. Throughout the day, children explore literacy, mathematics, science, physical education and the arts.

If you have a child born in 2013, please call 416-393-9070 to make an appointment to register your child. We will be booking appointments for registration from Monday, February 6th until Friday, February 17th. If you have a neighbour who has a child this age, please pass this information on to them.

When you come to register, please bring in the following information:

1. Child's Birth Certificate, Permanent Resident Card, Citizenship Papers or Refugee Papers

2. Two pieces of identification that show your address (utility bill, rental or lease agreement, bank statement) *A driver's license is not accepted.*

- 3. Child's Health Card
- 4. Child's Immunization Record
- 5. Legal Custody Document (if applicable)

Now and Then ...

At Earl Beatty there have been great achievements and milestones for our students as well as our beloved building. Its foundation is part of our legacy and embraces our motto: *learning togethe*r. We are working tirelessly to build on its legacy to support the success of Earl Beatty students, today and the years to come.

It is to look to the past as we take a step to build the future. Archive records have revealed parents and school community exploring opportunities to improve our schoolyard for decades, or April 1973 to be exact, with an "Honest Earl's Bargain Basement Sale", the first of what was to be an annual sale, offering used children's clothes from newborn to age 14 and sporting equipment in good condition. "Are they going to offer coffee there?", says Sheila, a very tired Mom of 3 children. "All proceeds of the sale will support our schoolyard greening."
