EQAO Results

Our school results have been released - below is a summary of achievement. As a school community we were pleased to see significant improvements in Reading, Writing and Mathematics at both the Grade 3 and Grade 6 level since the last EQAO testing that took place in 2014. We will continue to work to understand the needs of our students at an even deeper level, further developing evidence based-instructional strategies that increase student achievement and, in alignment with the TDSB framework, focus within the areas of Achievement, Equity and Well-Being, throughout the school year.

Orange Shirt Day

Earl Beatty actively participated in Orange Shirt Day on September 30th. The day has become a national movement to recognize the experience of survivors of residential schools, honour them, and show a collective commitment to ensure that every child matters. The initiative called for

every Canadian to wear an orange shirt in the spirit of healing and reconciliation, which were in abundance throughout the school. Under the leadership of Ms. Swire and her Grade 7/8 class, her students shared oral stories and artistic creations with many classes, several staff and students shared books and stories within the classroom, and announcements each day presented the experience of residential school survivors. A number of community members shared personal connections to the impact of this past government policy, with the power of their words significant, the misguided choice in the creation of this practice evident, and the resilience of their character inspirational.

It was wonderful to see so many families come out and see so many of the wonderful activities going on throughout the school and in our classrooms. Students proudly showed their family members examples of their learning, while teachers provided an outline for the learning, expectations and inquiry taking place in the classroom. French Programs Application Deadline

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's French Immersion or Extended French programs, the TDSB offer an online process for applying to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten
- Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4

The TDSB guarantees an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. Transportation is provided as per the Board's Transportation policy. The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2017 are:

• Applications for Early French Immersion (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), must be completed online between November 1, 2016 and December 1, 2016.

• Applications for Junior Extended French must be completed online between January 9, 2017 and February 2, 2017.

Offers of placement within your chosen program will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window. Please note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.
