Principal's Message

Lateness

A student who arrives late interrupts the teacher, fellow students, and the office. As well, children may miss important instructions or messages at the start of the school day. The school day begins at 8:42a.m. and return from lunch is 12:27p.m. Students who are late must sign in at the office and pick up a late slip before going to class.

It is also important that students are picked up promptly at our 11:30a.m. and 3:15p.m. dismissal times. Primary students are only dismissed to their parent/guardian. If a parent/guardian is not on time at dismissal, the child will be brought to the office to wait.

Visitors in the School

As part of the TDSB's Safe School practices, all parents, visitors, and volunteers entering the school are required to report to the office first. This must occur before going to see a teacher. At the office you will be asked to sign in and pick up a tag indicating that you are a "Visitor."

Safety First

The school has been made aware of students crossing against the lights at Danforth Ave and Woodington Ave. This is unsafe for pedestrians as well as drivers. Please remind your children of safety rules when crossing the street

Peanut Allergy Alert

Please be aware that we have students at Earl Beatty with severe allergies to peanuts or peanut products. These allergies are potentially life threatening and can be triggered by just the smell of peanuts or peanut butter. As a result, we request that you do not send any foods to school that might contain peanuts or peanut products. Students are also asked not to share snacks. We all need to be vigilant in order to ensure that no child is put at risk due to a food allergy.

Litterless Lunches

Please help to reduce waste by ensuring that your child brings a litter-free lunch to school each day. Avoid Ziploc bags and foil-wrapped individual packaging, and use reusable containers and refillable bottles instead. Children are asked to return any garbage or compostable waste home.

Working towards a scent-reduced environment

Exposure to perfumes and other scented products can trigger serious health reactions in individuals with asthma, allergies, migraines or chemical sensitivities.

Staff, students and visitors in TDSB schools are strongly encouraged to avoid or reduce the use of fragranced products, and to replace them with unscented alternatives.

This is a request to voluntarily refrain from chemical-based scented products, and not a ban on scented products.

Earl Beatty Parking Lot

The Earl Beatty Parking lot is reserved for staff and TDSB employees during the day from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is a lot of coming and going for workers and TDSB support staff during the day and there must be parking for them. It is, however, open to patrons of the Community Centre in the evenings. The north end of the parking lot (Glebeholme) is chained around 10 p.m. But the south gate stays open.

In December, TDSB trucks and snowploughs will begin Winter Maintenance. That means that the lot will be ploughed and/or salted on any given night from 11 p.m. to 2 a.m. Due to the possibility of snow and ploughing, community members are advised not to park in the TDSB parking lot overnight.
