Choice Board Follow Up

Verbal/Linguistic

- Use storytelling or journal entries to share a day in the life of the woodlot
- Invent a slogan for the protection of our naturalized areas
- Write a poem or story about an animal characteristic
- Participate in a debate on the use of pesticides on crops, lawns or parks

Logical/Mathematical

- Create a game using some facts you learned today
- Make a calendar to show the life of a living thing over the course of a year
- Imagine a world without trees... have a discussion of what you think that would be like.
- Observe animal activity in your school yard and surrounding areas and record your findings

Visual/Spatial

- Design a poster or mural to illustrate the life cycle of an animal
- Invent an advertisement to illustrate how we can help our environment
- Create your own plant or animal using an art form of your choice illustrating it's unique characteristics

Interpersonal

- Have one student interview another highlighting the unique characteristics/ adaptations of a living thing in the woodlot
- Assume the role of an animal and conduct a class meeting to discuss why humans should protect that animal and its habitat
- Create a set of rules that could allow humans and animals to live in harmony

Free Choice

Body Kinesthetic

- Create a sequence of movements (or choreograph a dance) to display how a variety of animals move
- Build or construct a model of a living thing or an animal habitat
- Use drama (skit/tableau) to demonstrate how humans can protect animals and the places they live
- Create puzzle cards to illustrate the life cycle of a living thing in the woodlot

Musical Rhythmic

- Write and perform a rap or song about something you learned today
- Collect and present songs of a common theme related to your visit
- Invent a game where the contestants need to recreate a variety of animal sounds/calls
- Make an instrument to mimic sounds of nature

Naturalist

- Use natural objects to create an animal highlighting unique characteristics
- Write a "How to Care For" Guide on an animal of your choice
- Create a new community where humans and animals live in complete harmony (model, paint, sketch, storytelling, written story, etc)

Intrapersonal

- Create an autobiography as a plant or animal
- Describe qualities and characteristics you possess that would help you live successfully in nature
- Describe how you feel about a negative or positive human impact on the environment
- Talk about a time when you felt proud about doing something kind for a living thing
