

AUTHOR VISITS AT EGLINTON

Last month, we had a surprise visit by Penny Draper, thanks to Mme Bettin. The grade 5 students who attended were very inspired by her talk about writing historical fiction set in Canada. Since her visit, her books have been consistently in demand.

In April, Ms. Whitworth has arranged for two authors to visit the school. On April 2, Rebecca Upjohn will be doing a presentation for our kindergarten to grade 2 students. Ms. Upjohn has written many award-winning books, including <u>Lily and the Paper Man</u>, <u>The Last Loon</u>, and <u>The Secret of the Village Fool</u>.

Then, on April 16 and 17, Claudia Dávila will do presentations for our grade 3 to 6 students. Claudia Dávila draws comics and children's books. We have three books written and illustrated by her in the library at this time: <u>Luz Sees the Light</u>, <u>Luz Makes a Splash</u>, and <u>Super Red Riding Hood</u>. We also have a number of books for which she provided the illustrations.

We are fortunate indeed to have the opportunity to meet and learn from these talented people!
