#### Kindergarten Registration

It's that time of year again when we will be registering new students to Kindergarten.

Registration will begin starting February 7, 2017. Children who will be 4 years old before December 31, 2017 (born in 2013) may enter Junior Kindergarten this September 2017.

Please call the office to book an appointment. Registration times will be from 10:00 – 11:30 in the am and from 1:30 – 3:00 in the pm.



" Would you like your child be in the gluten-free class, the lactose-free class, or the peanut-allergic class?"

Please bring these items with you when you are registering your child/children.

**Proof of age -** (birth certificate or passport)

**Proof of address -** two (2) pieces of identification that show your address, such as a phone bill, lease agreement, utility bill, etc.

**Proof of immunization** (the card that shows a list of needles your child has received)

#### **Health card**

#### Verification of date of arrival - if your child was not born in Canada

Families who are permanent residents and refugee claimants may register directly at the school. To register, please visit the International Programs and Admissions Office at 5050 Yonge Street, Toronto, for a TDSB school admission letter.

\* Please note that your child does not need to be with you when you are registering.

If you know of a neighbor with children ready for JK in September 2017 please pass on this information to them.

#### Chinese New Year – Spring Festival

Chinese New Year, known in modern Chinese as the "Spring Festival" is an important Chinese festival celebrated at the turn of the traditional lunisolar <a href="Chinese calendar">Chinese calendar</a>. Celebrations traditionally run from the evening preceeding the first day, to the <a href="Lantern Festival">Lantern Festival</a> on the 15th day of the first calendar month. The first day of the New Year falls on the new moon between 21 January and 20 February. In 2017, the first day of the Chinese New Year is on Saturday, 28 January.



Although there are many <u>interesting legends and stories</u> explaining the start of the Chinese New Year festival, the main two reasons for the festival are:

To celebrate a year of hard work, have a good rest, and relax with family To wish for a lucky and prosperous coming year

Chinese people believe that a good start to the year will lead to a lucky year. Chinese traditionally celebrated the start of a new year of farm work, and wished for a good harvest (when most were farmers). This has now evolved to celebrating the start of a new business year and wishing for profits and success in various vocations.

The main traditional celebrations of the festival include eating reunion dinner with family, giving red envelopes, firecrackers, new clothes, and decorations.

Chinese New Year is a time for families to be together. Wherever they are, people come home to celebrate the festival with their families. The New Year's Eve dinner is called **"reunion dinner"**, and is believed to be the most important meal of the year. Big families of several generations sit around round tables and enjoy the food and time together.

Every street, building, and house where CNY is celebrated is decorated with red. Red is the main color for the festival, as it is believed to be an auspicious color. Red lanterns hang in streets; red couplets are pasted on doors; banks and official buildings are decorated with red New Year pictures depicting images of prosperity.

Most of the decoration is traditionally done on Chinese New Year's Eve. Certain foods are eaten during the festival (especially at the New Year's Eve dinner) because of their symbolic meanings, based on their names or appearances. **Fish is a must** for Chinese New Year as the Chinese word for fish sounds like the word for surplus. Eating fish is believed to bring a surplus of money and good luck in the coming year. Other Chinese New Year foods include dumplings, spring rolls, glutinous rice cakes, and sweet rice balls.
