- 1. Opening of meeting: The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm
- **2. Approval of the minutes from October's meeting:** Approved by Steve Gould and seconded by Robyn Temins Sklar
- 3. Guest Speaker/Guest Report:

- 4. Chairpersons' Report: (Courtney Weiner and Suzanne Grant)
  - a. **Pro-Grant Mindfulness Presentation update –** Dr. Freedman will be offering a parenting workshop on Mindfulness on Wednesday February 4<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. Babysitting is available.
  - b. Lunchtime and after-school programs Mad science is offered Tuesdays at lunch and Tae Kwon Do is after-school on Tuesdays. The ukulele and fitness programs are both offered at lunchtime on Thursdays. Michelle asked about the lunchtime Lego program. This program is run by the teachers and not SAC. The Lego program is offered to students in grades 1-3 and run by teachers, including Ms. Teckert.
  - c. School play The idea of a school play was discussed at the last meeting. After looking at this program closer we realized that it's going to be a lot more work than first anticipated, therefore we are unable to offer it this year. The teachers will continue to run their individual classroom performances. Instead we could offer a lunchtime play program. One alternative that is being considered is having an outside company organize a lunch theatre program that would run for 13-15 weeks (depending on holidays/PD days) from February to May. The challenge is what grades to offer it to. Suzanne thinks that we shouldn't offer it to the older grades because they usually don't have much interest in any of the programs. We could offer it to students in grades 1-3, however; the outside company will not prepare a full production for that age group. If we offer the program to students in grades 2-5 then they can do a full performance. Parents agreed that they would like to see a final performance. The company would like to meet the kids before deciding what play to offer. The cost is approximately \$200 per student. The final

performance will be at school during the day or possibly in the evening. Michelle asked how many kids are needed to run the program. They would like around 20 kids but they need a minimum of 15 students. This program would really be replacing Alex Moses. Elizabeth stated that in other schools SAC has sold tickets (for about \$5) and refreshments. It was treated as a partial fundraiser. Michelle is interested in an alternative program to what Faywood has done in the past. It would be nice to know what play they would be offering. What have they done in the past? Suzanne will continue to get more information. Funds (\$3360.00) that had previously been allocated for the play, back in December 2014, can be put back into the balance.
