- g. Robotics Table Mr. Kahn has a robotic team and needs a practice table for the robots. It would last many years. It needs to be 8 feet by 4 feet and just needs some rails. He is asking for help for materials and assembling. He would be getting this all from Home Depot. Asking for help from SAC with purchasing and building. Daniel and Justin could help out. Shira will connect them with Mr. Kahn. SAC will pay for this. It would be under \$150. Motion passed by Riva and Julie. \$150 was approved for the Robotic table.

- j. Lunchtime programs- Riva- sign language starts tomorrow. This will take place in Room 13 if you would like to sign up and havent yet. Health card and OEN number are needed. The cost is 20\$. Ask Ms D. if you need your childs' OEN info. If parents would like to add another language to the programs, this needs to be decided in the next few months. Needs

to be at least 20-23 students enrolled to run the program.

- 4. Principal's Report- Thank you for coming and please continue to get involved in anyway that you can. Spread the word of you know anyone that would be interested and/or a good addition. Large and diverse voices needed, as we are a large and diverse school[©].
 - a. Numbers and Possible Reorganization- No reorganiztion needed this year! Kindergarten numbers are very good and give lots of opportunity for students. 2 of the grade 2 students will be moving classes and parents will be notified. This will happen as soon as possible for an easier transition. We were projected 509 students and we are currently at 493. We had many kindergarten students move over the summer. We have accepted many new students as well. Our numbers are large in grades 4 and up. Those grades will get lots of extra support. Primary numbers are below cap.
 - b. Facility Upgrades some upgrades have been done. Some include upgraded flooring, kindergartedn cubbies built in rooms 14 and 19. Open work request for a remodel of the kindergarten yard. Project started a few years ago and we will have more meetings around that. Gates will be placed at all open areas, walkways. Not sure if locked or shut at dismissal. May be installed next week. We are trying to keep everyone safe as there are many blindsopts

and walkways not needed and too open. If there are locks then we wil have a system in place soon. Much better in terms of supervision and safety. Will deter the dog walkers. 3 way mirror installed behind one of the portibles.

- c. New Staff thank you to everyone for making the new staff so welcome.
- d. Safe, Caring and Accepting Schools Committee asking for a volunteer from the parent community. Meet in the morning once a month 8am-8:30am. Time can be altered to fit everyones schedules. In attendance with the parent/community member volunteer, will be teachers, educational assistants, principal and vice principal who will review our safety climate concerns. Last year we met on a Tuesday. Not a large job. Thank you to Sue who volunteered.
- e. Health and Safety: Emergency Evacuation Plans A few details of the evacuation plan. Daycare and admin and teachers sat and decided a plan. 43 special needs students will need assistance in an evacuation. Lots of students to account for assistance and safe evacuation eg. 492 students, two permits, 79 staff. All classes line up in their designated spots. There is a red card and a green card. Teachers hold up green if all of their students are acounted for, red if someone is missing. There are floor captains assigned. Interpreters are assigned to specific areas so communication is clear. East enterence is the info centre for parents and media. Playscape is the first

aid ara. 4 places of evacuation are Dublin, Summit, John Polyani and Ancaster. Many staff have CPR and first aid. Some reasons for evactuation are: fire, gas leak. We will have 3 drills in spring and fall, missing student drills for teachers, lockdowns. This is what has been done up to this point. Julie asked, What is the process of stuents leaving and entering the building to go to their portibles? Ms. Schaeffer answered, there is a buddy and swipe card. Grades 3 and 4 are in the portibles. Portible install team put the bike rack on the field, this has been relocated to the front of the building where there is a camera. Eco school can maybe get some more bike racks. The Eco school team managed to get us a water refill station which is exciting.

- f. \$114992 is school budget. \$6098 for this year on technology which really only covers repairs. Technology is mandatory and we are lucky with what we have. Technology will continue to be a focus this year. We have studnts grades 4, 5 and up are using google doc, google classroom etc, which is very exctiing for them and we need the technology to be available for the 21st Century learner. Students are motivated to learn. Our new teachers are armed with knowledge in Robotics, Stem, and one is a digital lead learner. Library upgrades and technology is a continued focus.
- g. Josh Redmon is our 2nd year engineering resident. Worked with the junior grades. Riva asked about

teacher led programs. Please let riva know what programs are available in the school so she can guide parent questions about avaialble programs. They will go on the school calendar to make everyone aware and to get the word out. When Riva works for providers, she asks for spots available for families who need financial assistance. Another form of Faywood communication is available on Facebook, through Faywood ABC Home and School.

- 5. Fundraising Committee Report
 - a. Fundraising Report coodinator misses the school, and we all miss Alana Gordon too. Karen presented the updates on her behalf. Faywood makes roughly the same amount every year, which is about \$38-44 thousand. A breakdown was passed around. Pizza is the largest event. Funfair is more about bringing the community together not really about the \$. Danceathon make over 10, 000, Popcorn and Fro yo made around \$2500. If there are any more ideas for fundraising please let SAC know.
