SCHOOL RULES, ROUTINES & PROCEDURES

WEATHER GUIDELINES

Children need an opportunity to get exercise and free play time outdoors; however, weather conditions sometimes warrant that <u>indoor</u> recesses, lunch periods and pre-entry periods be considered necessary for student and staff safety.



Conditions warranting indoor recesses

- (a) Rain, thunderstorms, lightning, hail, extreme winds and extreme cold.
- (b) Cold weather: When temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -28C or lower children will remain indoors due to risk of frostnip and frostbite.

When temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -20 to -28C, recesses may be shortened to 10 minutes and lunch recess be 20 minutes depending on local conditions. Children will be monitored closely for signs of frostnip, frostbite or difficulty breathing.

CODE OF CONDUCT

We have found this code a great help in making our school a safe, caring environment.

- **Show Respect for Self**—Complete your homework, update your agenda, do your best, play fairly, be honest, follow rules and instructions
- **Show Respect to Others**—treat others with kindness and consideration; no putdowns; use good manners (such as please and thank-you)
- **Show Respect for Property**—treat school equipment and materials with care (such as when looking at library books)

Please read and review it regularly with your child. Should your child have problems observing the code of conduct we will be discussing the matter with you and seeking your co-operation. If we do not see an improvement after discussion we will be forced to take more serious action. Together we can develop a positive, caring, learning environment.

STUDENT SAFETY & PARKING

For the last several years, staff, students, and parents/guardians have expressed concerns about traffic safety around the school and in the school parking lot. This issue has been repeatedly



raised in our monthly newsletters and discussed at Parent Council meetings on numerous occasions. Possible solutions have been advised by parents, the Caring and Safe Schools department at the TDSB, and the Toronto Police Services Traffic department.

When dropping off and picking up students, it is important for cars to be parked in the outer parking lot and for children to be walked to the play area. Parents should not be parking in the fire access route in order to drop off or pick up students. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated. The safety of all our children is of utmost importance.

To alleviate the traffic congestion in and around the school, parents/guardians are encouraged to walk your child to school. We are hoping that we can establish a student drop-off/pick-up area with the assistance of parents and guardians.

Under the guidance of Mrs. Surgenor, our library is currently being transformed into a "Learning Commons".

Why are we doing this? As content becomes more accessible online, a library becomes less about housing books, and more about connecting learners and constructing knowledge.

What changes are taking place?

- 1) The physical space is being reconfigured to reflect the needs of 21st century learning:
- Greater access to technology.
- A Maker Space area.
- Flexible groupings of tables.
- Instructional space with use of Smartboard.
- Cozy seating for reading and working throughout the space.

2) Learning Partnerships are developed so that:

- EVERYONE is engaged in the learning process, including students, teachers, Principals, and community members.
- Teachers become learning coaches and facilitate new learning.
- technology based learning partnerships enabling integrated learning opportunities (real-world, global, cross-curricular, INQUIRY DRIVEN)
- The Learning Commons supports a school-wide culture of inquiry.


3) Technology will be used to learn and communicate collaboratively:

- Technology "specialists" within our school will share expertise through learning partnerships with other teachers and students.
- Students will learn how to use technology as an educational tool
- Students will explore to emerging technologies (Web 2.0 based).

GRADE 3'S—MS CHANG'S CLASS & "SCIENTIST IN THE SCHOOL"

On December 14, a scientist came to our classroom to teach us about Forces. We learned that a force is an invisible push or pull that causes movement. The 4 forces that we learned about are: gravity, friction, magnetism, and electrostatic forces. You can measure a force using the unit Newtons. We did many fun experiments using catapults, magnets, toy cars, and we even made a marble roller coaster. Forces are really important in our lives because they can help us everywhere and are all around us.



School Year

Toronto Public Health (T.P.H.) provides dental programs to children from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8.

To identify children with oral health problems, a screening program is offered to students in accordance with the Ontario Ministry of Health requirements for mandatory health programs. The screening is an assessment by a dental hygienist using sterilized instruments. The dental hygienist will assess the need for topical fluoride, scaling, sealant and any other obvious dental needs.

As a follow up to the screening, only parents whose children are identified as requiring dental services will be notified. A note to that effect will be sent home with your child/ren for your information and action. You may also receive a phone call from T.P.H. dental staff to assist you in accessing care.

Please be advised that this screening assessment does not replace the dental examination done by a licensed dentist.

If you do not wish your child/ren to be screened, please inform the school.
