## Act – What will our Learning Experience at Forest Valley Look Like?

Each field trip to Forest Valley is designed to be a complete **Inquiry Learning Cycle** that can integrate with previous learning and ignite further learning back at school.

This **Inquiry Learning Cycle is based on the inquiry processes** found in the <u>Kindergarten Curriculum (p.</u> 15), <u>Social Studies 1-6</u>, <u>History and Geography 7 and 8 (p. 22)</u> and <u>Science and Technology 1-8 (p 12-18)</u>, The Creative Process <u>Arts (pp. 19-22)</u>, Achievement Criteria <u>Language (pp. 17-18)</u> and the Problem Solving Model <u>Mathematics (pp. 12-13)</u>.

<u>The Lorax and Our Local Community</u> (\*activities will vary depending on weather, class readiness and availability)

- **1. Get me interested- Engagement** Formulate Questions
  - Share a letter from the Lorax and ask our Framing Question: What might the Lorax think of our Forest Valley community?
- 2. Let me explore- *Exploration* Gather and Organize Information
  - Explore Forest Valley to assess human impact on real life aspects of Dr. Seuss' Lorax
  - Map our journey to keep track of our learning and build spatial awareness
- 3. Give me a chance to apply my learning- Investigation- Interpret and Analyse
  - Depending on the weather and season decide on an eco-action that can be taken here at Forest Valley to help take care of nature (e.g., mulching trees, feeding the birds)
- 4. Let me talk about my learning- *Debrief Evaluate and Draw Conclusions* Let me plan what I want to learn next- *Communicate*
