Principal Taylor's Update

Mr. Taylor spoke about recent school events:

first recognition assembly held just before the winter break. Recognized classrooms. Established "Bulldog paws" - teachers can recognize individual students and post them. Tentative name for this wall is the "Givins/Shaw Pawsitive Wall". Another recognition assembly prior to the March Break.

Mr. Taylor also went over the guests who had visited in the first term. Right to Play coordinator for Ghana; our Member of Parliament; our Trustee, 15 educators from Denmark; our Superintendent, and the Director of the TDSB.

Upcoming - a Student Achievement Officer from the Ministry of Education will come to do some professional development with our staff.

Our Arts committee is currently working with parent representatives to coordinate a school arts initiative. More to come on this.

Our graduating grade 5 and 6 students have the opportunity to go skiing at Skyloft in Uxbridge on Feb. 3 and Feb. 16.

We also have our visit to Alexander Muir Gladstone for students on the afternoon of January 17 and the information night for parents at AMG is on January 17 at 6:00 p.m.

Nutrition Committee

Movie night – We had yet another successful movie night and fundraised roughly \$1600. \$500 of which went to Renten's family.

We will have another movie night in the Spring: date and time to be determined.

Nutrition Education Programming – A meeting with our staff liaison Ms Halton introduced the Rainbow Plate programming. Rainbow Plate is a non-profit educational foundation which brings nutritional education programmes into the school. The nutrition committee budget could accommodate programming if there is interest among the teachers for kindergarten and grade 5/6 classrooms, or pay for the option of a school wide assembly about nutrition. Ms Halton will see if any teachers sign up for these programmes.

Cooking Club - We discussed the Cooking Club idea with Ms Halton and Emily Zimmerman created a 4 week afterschool programme: a working document of 4 very strong workshop ideas and recipes to explore. This cooking club could take place in the last weeks of school. We will have to gauge interest and will get permission from the teachers about using the staff lounge only for the occasional bake off or stove use. The majority of the after school programme would happen outdoors and most recipes are no heat required.

Cook Book – Letters have been sent out to restaurants in the immediate area around the school asking for recipe submissions for the 2017 Givins Shaw Cook Book. Restaurant submissions will be hopefully come in for February 1st. The school wide ask for recipe submissions will hap-

pen this spring and the book will be again printed in time for Mother's Day. This year, with the help of Melissa Armstrong and Barry Martin, we will be using a web-based format for submissions which will help facilitate the layout and publication processes. If you didn't get a recipe in last year, think about getting one in this year!

School –wide lunchtime fundraiser is in discussion. Please stay tuned.

Nutrition Committee newsletter – Our committee is still in discussion of how to maintain the nutrition committee newsletter. Melissa Armstrong has generously purchased a domain name for the newsletter so that we will have a website for the year and we might also have a Facebook page. Talks are still happening, but feedback will be welcomed!
