Nutrition Committee

Usually meet once a month (1 t o1.5 hours either after drop off or after school).

Morning Snack: Must provide a fruit or vegetable, a grain and a dairy. If there are any concerns about the snacks, or special requests, please contact us or pop head in and let Alex know (she works in the kitchen in the mornings).

Funding: Some funding that comes from the City, but cover all the costs (about \$0.39/student). School Council provided some money last year and fundraising was done (movie night and a GS cookbook). This year there is a plan for another cookbook, with more recipes from local chefs.

Eco Committee

Donna Diakun - co chaired the committee last year. Chair this year has not been decided (contact Donna if you are interested in joining the committee or being Chair).

Overview of committee: Various events through the year - clothing in the spring, book sale in June last year, Eco Hop in spring, spring mulch clean up/bike swap day.

In the past, a number of green initiatives were done through application for grants. This year, there is a plan to put plaques on the plants and trees that have been planted over the years to help the kids understand what they are. We will have to do some fundraising for that. Meeting is upcoming. All are welcome to come!

Technology Committee

The School Council Committee is made up of Vivian Rossteuscher (works with Apple Canada), Garth Nichols (works with technology in education), Bretton Fosbrook, Mark Zims (works at MARS). This Committee is an advisory committee to the School's technology committee (made up of teachers and Dan Taylor). This committee has yet to meet this year but will be regrouping.

Mr. Taylor advised that the teachers have put together a technology plan, and an implementation plan. There is work being done with Apple Canada which will help set a base line on where needs are with resources and teachers abilities. Apple is presenting its report on this base line to teachers October 4th. It was noted that the people from Apple Canada are educators themselves. The Principal will bring forward the plan for the October School Council meeting.

The school already has two Apple TVs in Ms. Stockton and Mr. Smith's rooms. Idea is to have it in every class in the school. May take years to get there, but it is starting.

Transition Committee

Proposed new Committee to look at potential issues with Grade 6 leaving GS after this year. The committee could look at two separate areas (or both):

what events will be happening or should be happening for Grade 5 that in the past would have been in the Grade 6 year (for example graduation),

Principal's Notes:

Thank you for the welcome to your neighbourhood and to the School Council for organizing the three coffee morning gatherings in the past week.

Off to a great start to the year – no reorganization – approximately 20 students under projection but that is spread out across the grades – we are expecting more when some of the local construction is completed which is supposed to be within a few months

Since arriving at Givins/Shaw at the end of June, I have met several times and had ongoing conversations with our School Council chairs and have come to really value their advice on matters of school improvement and community inclusion.

First thing to be examined was our forms of communication – web site, twitter account, email tree, blogs, hard copies, etc. – In August, Dale and 8 teachers met with the main person at the TDSB in my office regarding website design and we continue to monitor the content for ways to improve – more staff have links or are exploring the idea – School Council has secured ownership of the

<u>www.givinsshaw.com</u> site name which will redirect anyone to our school's TDSB site. We have secured the site for the next 10 years.

Now that we have secured the website name, we are exploring marketing options with the TDSB and looking at everything from signage to bulletin board backdrops to banners.

Technology plan. Each meeting with the council executive or with the staff has inevitably come back to the need to increase our inventory, fluency, and acumen with regards to the use of technology with our students. We think the initial plan we have formed with the staff, TDSB advisors, representatives from Apple, and the council executive, will provide a great foundation and increased dexterity of pedagogical styles for Givins/Shaw.

Givins / Shaw going K – 5 after the 2016/17 school year

The process to change the grade range at Givins/Shaw to a K - 5 model was concluded in full last year and approved by the TDSB.

Focus on safety to start the year. Since the start of the school year, the staff has had training on diabetes protocol, Sabrina's Law, Asthma awareness, Abuse and Neglect protocol, and facility safety.

What's Next?

Athletics are up and running - cross country, boys and girls slo-pitch

Many groups have permitted our school for different functions – volleyball, chess, international languages

Many clubs will likely to be starting later in the fall

We will continue to post information about Givins/Shaw events on the school's site.

Being allergy aware – teachers are asking for non-food ways to honour birthdays due to concerns around potential food allergies – we continue to place an emphasis on cleanliness before and after eating—
