I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and my role here at Hilltop Middle School. My name is Larry Lippa and I am the guidance counselor at Hilltop Middle School. I am at Hilltop 2.5 days per week as I also have three other schools which I support.

My role as guidance counsellor is to advocate for all students and to assist in providing them with a variety of supports to ensure that their academics, social/emotional health, and mental health are in good standing. Students at Hilltop have access to individual assistance and short-term counselling through the teacher/student referral process. As well, my role as counsellor is to deliver a comprehensive educational career/life planning process through the "Creating Pathways to Success," curriculum. This includes opportunities for students to learn about themselves and others, what opportunities are available to them in the future, who they want to become, and setting goals and creating an Individual Pathway Plan (IPP). Another key responsibility as guidance counsellor is to provide students with support for the transition from Junior to Middle School and from Middle to High School. These are called orientation and exit programs. I also provide students with peer assistance programs like the "Peer Mediation Program" where students assist other students in resolving minor conflicts and the "Peer Tutoring Program" where students assist other students with their academics. Lastly, as guidance counsellor at Hilltop, I take pride in assisting classroom teachers and our administration in providing a quality character education program where we focus on the TDSB Character Traits. Here at Hilltop, we have monthly assemblies where we honour and recognize students who have been role models for the rest of the students in areas such as respect, responsibility, and kindness to name a few.

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
Remembrance Day Assembly

Toronto Public Health: Flu Clinics

Each year Toronto Public Health offers free Flu Clinics for all Ontario residents. The clinics will be held throughout the city from October 28 to November 30, 2015.

Street Safety:

Drivers are reminded to do their part to keep children safe near school buses.

Drivers should follow these tips:

- Stop and never pass a school bus when its red lights are flashing.
- Leave space around school buses and avoid blocking school bus loading zones so children can enter and exit safely.
- Be prepared to stop for a school bus at any time, not just during school hours.
- · Always obey the rules of the road and watch for children, especially in school zones.
- · Stop for pedestrians at crosswalks and school crossings.

Parents can also help keep their children safe by reminding them to be aware of their surroundings when they are on or near school buses.



Hallowe'en Safety:

If your family is planning to take part in Hallow'en festivities, please review these safety precautions with your child:

- Remind children of road safety rules. Cross only at corners. Do not criss-cross the road.
- With older children, be sure to know what other events (such as parties) they plan on attending.
 - Set time limits when children should return home.
- Children should NEVER eat any treats until parents have had a chance to go through them and inspect them..
- Have your child carry a flashlight.
- NEVER go into a stranger's house.
- NEVER trick or treat with people you do not know.
- Trick or treat only at homes you know.
- Children should always stay in groups if no parent is present.
- Younger children should ALWAYS be accompanied by an older person.

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French Immersion and Extended French Application Procedures:

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's French Immersion or Extended French programs, TDSB offers an online process for applying to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten;
- · Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4
- · Middle Immersion which begins in Grade 4 (available in a limited number of schools)

TDSB guarantees an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. Transportation is provided as per the Board's Transportation policy.

Please note the timelines for applying for these programs for September 2016:

- Early French Immersion: November 2 and December 3, 2015.
- Junior Extended French or Middle French Immersion: January 4 and January 28, 2016.

Please note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student. Further information on French as a Second Language programs and the application process is available online at www.tdsb.on.ca/french.
