We are looking forward to the construction of our new field - complete with artificial turf and a fantastic track surrounding the field! Construction begins in late June.

H. J. Alexander Tentative Staffing Model for 2017:

Here is the Staffing Model for next year that was presented at last month's School Advisory Council Meeting.

JK/SK (YEAR 1 AND YEAR 2) – We will be offering 6 Full-Day Kindergarten classes.

For Grades 1 to 5:

- 3 Classes of Grade 1
- 1 Class of Grade 1/2
- 3 Classes of Grade 2
- 1 Class of Grade 2/3
- 4 Classes of Grade 3
- 1 Class of Grade 3/4
- 2 Classes of Grade 4
- 1 Class of Grade 4/5
- 2 Classes of Grade 5

The following Special Education Programs will continue to be offered:

- Primary HSP and 2.5 Special Education Resource Teachers

We are happy to also have:

- -A full-time Teacher-Librarian
- -1.5 Music/Dance Teachers
- -A full-time French Teacher
- -1.5 Phys. Ed. Teachers
- -1.5 ESL Teachers
- -0.5 Reading Recovery Teacher

As you may have noticed, some of our classes from JK to Grade 5 are "Combined Grade" classrooms. This is by necessity, as it is the only model that could meet the Ministry and Board criteria for the placement of our students. If you would like additional information on combined grades, please visit www.edu.gov.on.ca and enter the key words "An introduction to combined grades".

Over the next month, we will be planning the classes for the next school year. Our staff will be dedicating a lot of time and effort into creating classes that will be "balanced" and will take into account the individual needs of students as well as the needs of our whole school. Among other things, we will be looking at the grade levels and gender, as well as the social, behavioural, academic and special education needs of all children.
