OPAL values play as an important part of child development and learning and understanding and experiencing the environment in all different types of weather conditions is important for students to develop important life skills, such as self-regulation as well as developing their bodies physically. months we will begin to accumulate "loose parts" such as tires, pool noodles and more for student to use during outdoor play time. "Self-directed play is a necessary and important part of every child's life."
