Principal's Message



We are excited to welcome April and we hope that spring weather will soon be upon us! We continue to thank you for your patience and cooperation with our roof project. We anticipate completion of the 71,000 square foot project soon! Please be sure to read the correspondence that we send home regarding the project and feel free to call or visit us if you have any questions or concerns. We have been working closely with our Health and Safety Department to ensure that the safety of our staff and students is at the forefront of all undertakings related to the project.

Summer school registration has begun. Elementary summer programs increase engagement and build self-confidence in our students. They are open to all students. This summer, from July 4 – 27, schools are opening across the city to help build reading, writing and math skills in students from Kindergarten to Grade 8. There are a wide range of classes, from beginner to advanced, to help you improve your conversation skills, further your education, and prepare for citizenship and language proficiency tests. 2018-2019 School Year

Student class placement is always a complex process, during which we strive to achieve a good fit for all students. Careful time and consideration are given by staff and administration when considering the best learning environment for each child. Classrooms are organized based on a balance of the following factors: academic levels, social emotional needs, program needs, gender, learning styles, group dynamics. If you wish to make us aware of any program and/or special needs that may impact your child's learning, please submit this to the main office in writing no later than April 25, 2018. We will take your note into consideration, however, we cannot guarantee a specific placement. Please note that last minute requests will not be considered because classes are organized during the month of May. Also note that requests for a particular teacher cannot be accepted as teacher assignments are tentative until September.



Islington JMS is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment for all students. 
CELEBRATING WOMEN AND GIRLS AT OUR SCHOOL AND WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY

Learning Buddies is a wonderful opportunity for our youngest learners to get to know some of the 'big kids' in the school. It is also a fantastic leadership opportunity for our older students as they guide and support Kindergarten students on their learning journey. In Learning Buddies, the classes involved participate in a variety of planned learning opportunities together: art, music, dance, drama, mathematics, and literacy. The relationship the children build with one another often lasts throughout the years the children are at Islington JMS.

'Little' Buddy benefits

- -increased social communication and conversational skills
- -extension of vocabulary and oral language skills
- -feeling 'special' (because they know some of the 'big kids)
- -increased self-esteem (again, because they know some of the 'big kids')
- -hearing stories read aloud (modeling of reading fluency, phrasing, and expression)
- -regular opportunities to practice reading simple books with one-to-one assistance
- -enjoying fun, positive experiences with a 'big kid' who has become a recognizable face in the school community
- peer support

'Big' Buddy Benefits

- -increased self-esteem (from being looked up to by a younger student)
- -fostering leadership skills
- -development of mentoring skills
- -authentic opportunities for problem-solving
- -increased oral communication (conveying ideas in a clear, concise manner)
- -furthering literacy skills (when reading and writing with their buddies)
