take place on February 13th, 20th, & 27th, and that our school will be closed on Monday Feb. 17th, for Family Day.







From the Guidance Department: Important Secondary School Information

For Grade 8 Parents: This week I will be meeting with all Grade 8's to discuss Secondary School course selection. They will receive from me a booklet called *Choices*, which contains a lot of information about high school courses and diploma requirements. I strongly suggest that you read the booklet over with your child so that you are familiar with the information and can help your child make good choices. Descriptions of courses can be found on the TDSB website at www.tdsb.on.ca/choices or on MyBlueprint at www.myblueprint.ca/tdsb.

Students will also receive a course selection sheet for their home school. Even though some students have selected to apply for optional attendance at other high schools, they will complete a form for their home school so that they are prepared before the acceptance date of February 15. If at that time they get accepted at another school, I will switch the forms for them. Students are asked to have their course selection sheets approved by their teachers and their parents, signed, and returned to me no later than Friday January 31.


Please remember that all optional attendance sheets are due to the high schools by Friday January 31.

I will be helping students to input their course selections on MyBlueprint during the first and second weeks of February. Please ensure that your child has created an account by the end of this week so that they are able to access the course selections. The URL for this site is




