Spring 2015, Grades 7-12 School Climate Surveys

Section 169.1 (2.1) of the Education Act and Policy/Program Memorandum (PPM) 145, Progressive Discipline and Promoting Positive Student Behaviour, require boards to conduct anonymous school climate surveys of students, staff, and parents at least once every two years. The implementation plan for the school climate surveys has two phases.

Phase 1 (completed in Spring 2014): In 2013-14, students in Grades 4-6 completed the TDSB's online Student School Climate Survey. Schools also invited parents/guardians/caregivers and all school staff to complete the Ministry of Education's School Climate Surveys for parents and staff.

Phase 2: In Spring 2015, students in Grades 7-12 will complete the TDSB's online Student School Climate Survey. Schools will also invite parents/guardians/caregivers and all school staff to complete the TDSB's online School Climate Surveys for parents and staff.

Kennedy P.S. will conduct the School Climate Survey for our grade 7 & 8 students between March 23rd & April 2nd. Thank you Mr. Lucas on overseeing this for our staff & students.
