TOUR FOR HUMANITY

This exciting educational initiative, presented by Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Center for Holocaust Studies, is a fully self-contained mobile classroom that educates students in a highly interactive environment. The Tour for Humanity inspires and empowers students to raise their voices and take action against hate to help make the world a better place. This unique project, designed to initiate discussion on critical human rights issues, offered our stu-

dents the opportunity to learn about a variety of topics in Canadian history including the Indian Residential Schools System and the systemic internment of Japanese Canadians during the Second World War. The goal of the workshop was to enhance the students' ability to become proactive members of society by influencing positive change.

Girls Government

M.P.P. Soo Wong has been working with the grade 8 girls at Kennedy P.S. to discuss <u>Equal Voice</u>, which has been working hard to roll out a youth engagement program called Girls Government across the province and country. Girls Government is a non-partisan initiative MPP Cheri DiNovo, Parkdale-High Park, founded in 2008 designed to give young women in grade 8 space to be engaged politically, and to develop a lasting interest in politics. Girls selected from local schools have the opportunity to work directly with their MPP to develop a policy initiative and learn ways to effectively push that policy initiative forward. As



this program is about government, the girls decide – through lively democratic debate – which issue they would like to tackle. This program culminates in April when the girls visit Queen's Park, host a press conference and discuss their issue with relevant officials. As well, there is an optional trip to Parliament Hill in Ottawa.

4 representatives of our grade 8 girls will join Ms. Cohen, Ms. Khan and M.P.P. Wong in this year's Equal Voice which is looking to convene all Girls Government programs at Queen's Park on **Tuesday, April 12** to commemorate April 12, 1917, when An Act to amend the Ontario Election Act was passed beginning to give women the vote in Ontario and to set the clock on the countdown to the 100th anniversary of that milestone in April 2017.



Remembrance Day Poster Awards at the Legion


