This past month, our school building has been beaming with brilliant "busy-ness". Our students enjoyed the anti-bullying presentation 'Wired'. Author Mike Umer was here to meet with grades five and six classes. Honourable Jim

Karygiannis worked with our grade fives, and the Grade seven and eight students took part in Junior Achievement day. In addition, our annual music event with the Bethune Band took place at Jackson's Point and our various clubs and teams continued to meet. Finally now, we are busy working the Winter showcase, Boston Pizza Family night and several other year end activities.

In the classroom, staff continues to work on developing strong effective programs for our students both in literacy and numeracy as teachers work collaboratively to support our School Improvement Plan via teaching and learning. In December, the Kindergarten team will focus on 'Early Developmental Instruments', while the Primary, Junior & Intermediate classes will spend time working on 'success Criteria and Learning Goals'.

Our numeracy pathway will center on 'using our findings to inform our work'. In the New Year, we plan to review our EQAO results and 2013 data. In particular, we continue to examine gender differences; use Dot Scores and identify strategies that improve student comprehension in "problem solving". Our staff continues to meet to track students' progress while using effective strategies in the classrooms to determine successful practice and the modifications need to be made.

Finally, the winter holidays are fast approaching. This time of year brings about a flurry of activity as we aim to wrap up 2013 with the same energy that we opened the year with. The last day of school for this term is Thursday, December 19th, 2013. The long awaited holidays are between Monday, December 23rd, to Friday, January 3rd. School will reopen on Monday, January 6th, 2014.
