On Monday November 14th, students




brought home their Fall Progress Report. When reviewing and celebrating your child's report card, please engage in dialogue with your child about

By using School Cash Online, you help increase efficiency and security at schools by making payments directly into your school's bank account. This allows teachers and secretaries to focus on helping students, and not counting cash. Plus, you get to stay informed of your child's activities and needs!

Powered by KEV Group, School Cash Online is the industry leader in school financial management. The new system puts all of the school fees available to your student online for purchase. Schools post their items and activities through the system and assign the relevant fees to your student. You can then choose to purchase these fees online through two different methods, including credit cards. You can also stay informed and keep track of which school
