#### Welcome to Guidance

My name is Elysa Tarascio and I will be your child's Guidance Counsellor this year. I would like to give you a brief overview of the Guidance program and tell you a little about my role. The Guidance curriculum is divided into three sections: student development, interpersonal development, and career development. The goals of this program for intermediate students are to help them:

- acquire the skills they need for lifelong learning (goal setting, cognitive awareness, organizational skills, time management, understanding how they learn and monitoring their own progress)
- develop the skills they need to work cooperatively with others and care about others (demonstrating self-discipline, taking responsibility for their own behavior, problem-solving, and global citizenship)
- gain an understanding of the choices available to them in the world of work and help them make informed decisions based on their interests and abilities (transitions from elementary to secondary, career awareness, goal setting, and pathways)

My Role: I will be coming into classrooms in the fall to introduce myself and talk to your children about guidance and how they can access individual help. As part of the program I will be preparing activities for Grade 6s and intermediate students to complete throughout the year on topics such as mindfulness, stress and anxiety, study skills, time management, goal setting, character education, bullying, and Essential Skills. I will work closely with the Grade 8s to help them choose secondary schools and courses. I will present parent information sessions about secondary school in October/November. Please keep reading newsletter alerts to find out when these sessions will be held and when secondary school information will be sent home, as it is very important to keep informed about options and deadlines.

I will be posting articles regularly in the school newsletter on topics of interest to parents. If needed, I am also available to speak with parents individually. If you would like to book an appointment, please call the school as I am servicing five schools and may not always be on site. I look forward to working with your child this year and to meeting with you later in the year.

### **High School Information**

Most of our Grade 8 students will be attending Dr. Norman Bethune next year, as this is their *home* school. However, there are other opportunities within TDSB that might be of interest to your child. Many of the programs require

### Ryan's Law, 2015

Ryan's Law, 2015 (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) was recently passed by the Ontario Legislature. This legislation supports the safety and well-being of students with asthma and requires that:

With parent's or guardian's permission, students be allowed to carry their asthma medication.

Students 16 years or older, are not required to have parent's or guardian's permission to carry asthma medication.

### Tips for Parents -How to Improve Your Child's Attendance:

- Talk with your child about the importance of attending school regularly;
- •Discuss with your child what happened at school each day;
- •Make sure your child stays healthy by eating nutritious food and getting enough sleep and exercise;
- Help your child prepare for the next school day;
- Avoid family trips or doctor's appointments during school hours;
- Support school rules and consequences for being late or absent;
- Show your child why education is important. Give specific examples of how education helps people succeed; and
- •Make sure your child stays home only when he/she is sick with a fever, vomiting or with a doctor's note.
