Settlement and Education Partnerships in Toronto (SEPT) is funded by Citizen and Immigration Canada (CIC), and is a partnership between Service Providers, the Toronto Public and Catholic School Boards and the Toronto Public Library. As part of the Welcoming Communities stream of settlement services, SEPT settlement workers seek to empower newcomers to integrate successfully into Canadian society through providing relevant settlement services, and to enhance social inclusion in schools through building bridges among newcomers and their school communities.

As the first few years of immigration are particularly difficult for newcomer families, the SEPT program aims at connecting families to settlement services in communities and schools so that they can get involved in communities, in schools and settle more quickly with their new lives. We also assist families who have been here for a long time because sometimes the settlement process can take a while. We work very closely with the school to enhance student performance and engagement in the community.
