New Concussion Procedure

The Concussions Policy P087 was adopted by the TDSB in March 2015. This was in response to the Ministry of Education's PPM No. 158 which expects all school boards in Ontario to develop and maintain a policy on concussions. The Concussions Policy P087 and Concussions Procedure PR712 were developed with the consultation of key stakeholders in the TDSB, as well as the broader community. These procedures include an individualized and gradual "return to learning and/or return to physical activity" plan for every student with a diagnosed concussion. The Concussions Policy P087 and accompanying Concussions Operational Procedures PR712 address TDSB's commitment to provide all appropriate supports to prevent and minimize the risk of sustained concussions. Timetable Changes

Space permitting, students can make changes to their timetable until the last day of classes in June. This year that would be Friday, June 10, 2016.

When students return in the Fall, only timetable changes that meet the following criteria will be made:

- · Straight Drop of a course
- · Students do not have a prerequisite for a course in their timetable
- · Student completed a course on the timetable during the summer
- · A Course is a prerequisite for your post-secondary program of study
- · Student is missing a graduating credit or compulsory credit
- Students who originally signed up for courses but due to timetabling constraints did not receive three of their top 7/8 selections and were therefore placed into **all three alternate** courses, can request to be placed into **two** of the top selections they originally chose but did not receive, space permitting.

 *If a student has any of their back up choices on their schedule, this is not a conflict.
 - *All timetable changes for grade 12 students end one week after the Fall University Fair.

University Acceptances

An important reminder to graduating Grade 12 students, that offers of admission to universities are conditional. It is critical that you read the conditions of your offer(s) and meet these conditions by the end of the school year. Students who do not meet their conditions will have their offers revoked.

Registration for E-Learning Courses
