1) Math Contests (attachment 1)

3) 2017/18 LPCI Course Selection

Students returning to LPCI will have an opportunity to submit their course requests via <https://www.myblueprint.ca/> from January 20, 2017 until February 3, 2017. Guidance counsellors will visit grade 9, 10 & 11 students on two occasions during this period to discuss the course selection process. A copy of the myblueprint course selection printout, once it is signed by a parent/guardian and the electives ranked and alternate courses indicated, will need to be submitted to homeform teachers on or before February 10. 4) OCAS Application Deadline is February 1

Students who are applying to Ontario Colleges must do so through the Ontario Colleges Application Service (OCAS) (www.ontariocolleges.ca). Complete and pay for your application on or before **February 1 in order to receive equal consideration for admission** to programs beginning the following September.

5) PLAR (Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition)

PLAR is a process whereby active TDSB day school or Continuing Education students may obtain credits toward their OSSD for knowledge and skills that they have acquired outside of the classroom. Students' prior learning is assessed and evaluated to determine whether they have met the provincial curriculum expectations as outlined in specific ministry curriculum policy documents.

14) Prestigious Scholarship Deadline Extensions to Monday Feb 6 at 3:30

UWO - Western University's National Scholarship Program

National Scholarships are designed to recognize all-round excellence. They are awarded on the basis of outstanding academic performance to candidates who demonstrate ability for creative and innovative thought and a passion for the pursuit of learning. National Scholarships also recognize exceptional achievement in extracurricular activities such as the arts and athletics. A special emphasis is placed on a candidate's commitment to community service through ongoing contributions to school and community life. Applicants require a minimum overall academic average of 90% on all Grade 12U/M courses.

LPCI is able to nominate up to 4 students for the National Scholarship Program. A Full Draft application is to be submitted.

Nominee's on-line National Scholarship application and all supporting documentation must be submitted to UWO by the February 14, 2017 deadline.

Schulich Leaders Scholarship

LPCI will nominate 1 candidate for this prestigious award

Launched in 2012, this \$100 million scholarship fund provides 50 undergraduate scholarships each year, across top Canadian universities.

Nominees must possess at least two of three criteria:

Academic excellence, Outstanding community, business or entrepreneurial leadership, Financial need

Nominees must be enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM) degree at one of Schulich's partner universities.

Application requires:

Universities where the Nominee wants to attend (must match Schulich list)

List of top three achievements (academic or other)

600 word essay demonstrating why they would make a great Schulich Leader

Optional 250 word essay to outline extenuating circumstances

Two letters of reference (at least one from a school staff member)
