#### **Early French Immersion Application Process**

The entry point to Early French Immersion is **Junior Kindergarten for September 2024.** 

The application to the Early French Immersion program will remain an online process managed by the Central French Department



The application program opens on **November 6**, **2023**.

The deadline for online applications is **December 1, 2023**.

An offer of placement in the program (<u>not</u> a specific school) is guaranteed to all on-time applicants. Families with an older sibling currently in an Early French Immersion program are still required to complete an online application for the new student. Interested families can apply via the <u>Application Link</u>.

At any time, please visit the <u>TDSB French website</u> to view a <u>video</u> that provides information about the TDSB French Language programs as well as the application and placement process in the Early French Immersion and the Middle French Immersion programs. 






Grade 4 Field Trip

# **Building Thinking Classrooms**








In Math, we learn, grow, and have fun together. Building thinking classrooms is a way in which we engage our learners in multiple ways of expressing their learning.


> was time to go on the field. I was super excited. In the middle of the game, I began to feel tired but I persevered. It was sad

On October 18, 2023, the Kindergarten children took a trip to Round the Bend Family Farm. There we saw and experienced many different aspects of farm life and activities.


