

## OCI Summer Institute Overview

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Summer School at Oakwood C.I. offers Toronto District School Board students already registered at OCI an opportunity to earn a 'reach-ahead' high school credit (GLD20), Leadership credit (GPP30), or recover a credit through Credit Recovery which count towards the completion of their OSSD.

## Summer Models of Delivery

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### A. GPP30 - Leadership and Peer Support

- This leadership course prepares students to act in leadership and peer support roles. They will design and implement a plan for contributing to the school and/or community, develop skills in communication, interpersonal relations, teamwork and conflict management. They will apply those skills in leadership and /or peer support roles for our incoming grade 9 students. Students completing this course will receive a grade 11 elective credit.

### B. RCR10 - Credit Recovery (math, science, English, social science)

- This program is designed for OCI school students who meet the expectations of a course they have received a failing grade. Students will explore "big ideas" in Credit Recovery to support the inquiry process.

### C. GLC20 - Reach Ahead

- This reach-ahead course prepares students to improve their literacy, numeracy and interpersonal/teamwork and conflict management skills. Students completing this course will receive a grade 10 elective credit.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

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Dear Parent/Guardian and Student:

As participants of the OCI Summer Institute Program, we have included the following policies as part of our *Code of Conduct*:

### **Attendance & Late Policy:**

Attendance will be taken at the beginning of the day in Homeroom AND after lunch. Since we must offer a minimum of 110 hours of instruction, **attendance is mandatory**. If a student is feeling ill and needs to go home, they will need to go to the office to call a parent/guardian and sign out. **No student shall be signed out without parent/guardian contact.**

**NOTE:** If a student is absent **3 full instructional days**, or accumulates **9 lates (of 20 minutes or more)**, he/she will be removed from the program.

### **Code of Conduct:**

Students are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner that is effective for establishing and maintaining a positive learning environment for all students and staff. The following expectations must be followed:

1. Electronic devices are permitted on school property and used during **non-instructional** time. TDSB and OCI is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged electronics.
2. Students are to refrain from using profanity inside the building.
3. Students need to adhere to a dress code that is appropriate and not offensive.

A progressive discipline approach will be taken with individual students who cannot adhere to these rules. If persistent opposition to these rules occurs, the student will be removed from his or her class to complete the work in the office or sent home for the day.
