Special Note to Students Applying for Scholarships and Bursaries

- Allow for at least **5 school days** notice for scholarship applications requiring signature by the Principal or Principal's designate.
- Allow for at least **10 school days** notice for reference letters to be written by the Principal, Principal's Designate, Guidance Counsellor or Teacher.
- Provide a resume or personal profile, and a letter of request for the reference letter (available in Student Services) which outlines the criteria and due date for the scholarship application. If the letter is to be mailed directly by the teacher, please provide an addressed and stamped envelope.
- Please be fair to your referees. Allow them **time** to prepare a letter of reference. This permits your referees to present you in a positive and relevant manner.
