# Halloween or Orange & Black Colour Day – Fri. Oct. 29

In compliance with Covid-19 public gathering limits, Hallowe'en parades are restricted once again this year. However, the Wedgewood staff would still like to make Hallowe'en fun for our students as much as possible. Fun class activities will be planned for the day. As an alternative to a Halloween parade, we encourage any students who wish to participate, to come to school in the morning dressed in their costumes or orange & black clothing. Families can then see the 'standing' costume display that will take place when students are lined up in their class lines at the entry bell.

Parents, we thank you for your cooperation to stand in the field and away from the pavement areas where the classes are lined up.

Teachers will do their health pass screening as usual and stay out for an extended period (8:15-8:25 am) so that families with more than one child can go around to see different classes before the students go inside to start their school day.

Please use the following guidance for Halloween at school Oct. 29th :

- parents are required to wear Covid-19 safety masks when they are on school property
- students should come to school dressed in their costumes or wearing orange and/or black colour clothing in the morning
- check that the costume allows for movement and not too long to prevent tripping
- no scary or gory-looking costumes
- no hand props or bulky accessories (Please save that for the actual trick or treating day)
- No face makeup to prevent soiling the Covid-19 mask
- students will not be permitted to go to the washrooms to change or apply makeup
- if the costume involves a character mask, students must still wear a cloth mask underneath

- the character mask should have large enough eye holes for children to see out of
- No food-sharing policy due to health and safety
- **OPTIONAL CANDY/TREAT Class Donations:** If would like to donate candy or treats to your child's class, please do so by Wed. Oct. 27th .Candy/treats must be individually wrapped and in unopened commercial packaging. NO NUT or PEANUT PRODUCTS! The teachers will distribute the treats on Friday, October 30th to take home at the end of the school day.

## 4. Treasurer's Report - Heather & Brittani

1<sup>st</sup> meeting in October on plans on how we want to use our funds. Similar meeting in Jan - how to use funds for remainder of the year. April/May - how much we want to use and save.

- Budget review including teacher wish lists, align on this year's priorities and • approve any allocations needed to start off the year
- We will aim to have future budget meetings in January (discuss second half of school year) and April/May (discuss preparation for the next school year)
- Voting process via Zoom: all attendees (one per household) can vote when voting is called for
  - For no action required
  - Against raise hand via Zoom
  - Abstain write "abstain" in chat
- Fall Projections attachment was posted to chat. •
- Starting balance for the year \$4300. •
- Currently have \$910 from cash online which we can also spend.
- Two fundraisers estimated outcome \$3000 for Basket Sales and Sprit Wear
- Discussion around if there any other fundraisers we can do in the year while abiding by Covid protocols.
- If skating is to happen- allocation to skates for sharpening. \$500. WFSA Voted FOR
- Grade 5 Grad: allocate 2-3K by year end with the assumption a trip and an in • person grad. Recommended spend now – \$1000. Revisit to add additional funds based on fundraising in the new year. WFAS voted FOR

- Raz Kids online reading Program Kindergarten to Grade 3. Licensing has 30 spots for students. 16 classes we require a license. Approx. \$1700. WFSA voted FOR
- Teacher allocations: historically WFSA provided \$100 each teacher to use at their discretion to buy crafts or other materials. Teachers submit expenses with an invoice. Set aside funds to support the teachers! Given the limited funds this year we can allocate \$50 for now and revisit. \$1200. WFSA voted **FOR**
- Sign up.com \$130yr to maintain the URL link. Useful for all of the sign ups. (we can hold off until we can host events with volunteer). WE can allocate and not spend if not necessary.
- Scientist in the school we have supported in the past. \$4800 for whole school.
  \$230 per class 20 in person and 1 virtual. We can allocate K 3 (will circle back with grade4/5 teachrs to determine of they will proceed with this or Mathup)
  16 classes. \$3680. WFSA voted FOR
- School virtual performance online magic show last year interactive. Celebrating arts in some way. Sometime in 22. (don't need to vote today)
- MathUp program targeted to grade 4/5. Free trial Nelson education. Fulsome math program. Its been a while since math has had a refresh in its materials. Stretch wish list item. Online subscription. \$600 license per class. estimate of \$4000. (Wait and See depending on trial). We could do a cost share? Waiting on 4/5 teachers to decide.

# 5. Health & Safety Update - Melani & Sarah K.

- a. Morning drop-off traffic safety concerns-comes up every year. Revisit some ideas:
  - i. A reminder of No parking/idling in the intersection of Swan & Martin Grove - do we need pylons? Pylon toppers. Shouldn't be parking here.
  - ii. General speeding in the area send a reminder to parents
  - iii. Swimming pool parking lot congestion
  - iv. No crossing guards parent advocacy calling the city and say we need crossing cards do an assessment. Will slow things down.
  - v. East parking lot Kiss & Ride status information sheet and publicize? Teachers opening the door and helped and stopped since Covid. Duty schedule – the three buses brings approx. 150 kids. We could look at volunteers. (take this away and reaching out to the city)

Parties - happening at the school/park. Keeping an eye on it.

- Increased retail price of sweatshirt from last year's \$25 to \$30 to match Marchant's suggested retail price and improve fundraising margin

- d. Virtual Scholastic Book Fair November 8-21

  - School has \$54.24 remaining in their rewards account (revenue was \$309 in rewards from last year's virtual book fair)
  - NEW Orders placed online are shipped directly to the school, saving parents on shipping charges. You will receive a manifest of the orders by order number. Orders are packaged individually. Easy for distribution.
  - Scholastic expects the school to receive the shipment 1-3 days after the fair ends so we should anticipate to distribute on November 26th - Sooky to advise procedure
  - We are helping out this year.

  - Weekly skating program traditionally runs January to March Break for Grades 1-5 at Wedgewood Rink (Tennis Court beside Park).
  - Need more time to see if we need to pull permit.
  - Need to determine weather we can proceed. To be followed up.
  - In January 2020, WFSA purchased 24 new helmets and 4 old helmets were still usable and not-expired (28 helmets in total)
