In December, the Enhancing Equity Task Force shared a report that provided a number of recommendations for how to support student achievement and well-being through improving equity within our system.


As a system, we are making bold and transformational changes that will not only support those who have traditionally been underserved, but will raise the bar for all students.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY



The celebration of March 8th as International Women's Day (IWD) recognizes the struggles of women against all forms of discrimination and exploitation, and focuses on the need for global equality, democracy and peace. On International Women's Day, women on all continents, often divided by national boundaries and by ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic and political differences join in the commemoration of this significant event. On March 8th, 1908, women needle trade workers in New York, reacting against their brutal exploitation, held a women's day demonstration. These women fought for the right to unionize and demanded the right to vote. The success of the rally led to similar rallies in other US cities and in other countries.
