APRIL is Sikh Heritage Month at the TDSB

On 22 March 2016, Trustees voted to designate April of each year as Sikh Heritage Month, making TDSB the first school board in Canada to do so, and matching recognition by the Province of Ontario in 2013.

As stated in the Sikh Heritage Month Act, 2013, c. 12, s. 1.:

"Sikh Canadians have lived in Ontario since the middle of the twentieth century. They represent a growing and dynamic population. April is an important month for the Sikh community. In this month, Sikh Canadians celebrate Vaisakhi, which marks the creation of the Khalsa and the Sikh articles of faith. The Province of Ontario recognizes the important contributions that Sikh Canadians have made to Ontario's social, economic, political and cultural fabric."

Sikh Heritage Month is to provide an opportunity for staff, students and community members to learn more about Sikh traditions and history, and celebrate the many contributions of Sikh Canadians. It is also a time to reflect on both the struggles and accomplishments of the many communities that contribute to Canada's rich cultural mosaic. From being turned away on Canada's shores during the historic Komagata Maru incident in 1914 to the many Canadians, such as award winning Canadian Sikh Women authors such a Rupi Kaur and Lily Singh, we must continue to progress.


The theme for this year's TDSB Sikh Heritage Month is one of the core Sikh Values – SEVA: Selfless Service. We are also celebrating HERitage of Sikh Women in Canada through a poster. It is an opportunity to continue dialogue on Equity and Inclusive curriculum throughout the year. The poster is on display in the school.

April is also Latin-America History Month at the TDSB

The theme for Latin-America History Month (LAHM) 2018 is: Recognizing our Diverse Spiritualities Through Our Stories: Learn About Our Many Roots. Latin-America/Abya Yala heritage is shared by more than 5000 students across TDSB, Encompassing the peoples of 21 different countries, linguistically, it represents over 500 hundred different languages spoken, including Indigenous and African languages such as Kuna and Garifuna.

Last year, TDSB's LAHM theme was: Hear Our Voices: Our Living Experiences! Escuchen Nuestrxs Voces: Nuestrxs Experiencias!, calling on us to subvert the singular understanding of Latin-America/Abya Yala's ethnic and racial identities. Building on this theme, the aim of the LAHM 2018 and K-12 Related Initiatives Planning Committee is to support TDSB staff and students to engage in courageous conversations and critical literature, building understanding around the many ways that students and families of Latin-America/Abya Yala and its diasporas practice their spiritualities, and centering its marginalized and silenced voices, lived experiences, and realities, including but not limited to those of Muslim Latinxs, Sikh Latinxs, as well as Mapuche or Garifuna youth).

Details of educational opportunities for students, parents/guardians, and staff will be shared in the coming weeks, along with the winning poster from the LAHM 2018 Artwork Competition.
