### Progress Reports and Parent/ Guardian/Teacher Interviews

Elementary Progress Report cards will sent home with students in FDK to Grade 6 on Tuesday November 14th.

In Grades 1-6, this report card will record students' general progress in working towards the achievement of curriculum expectations and their development of learning skills and work habits during the first weeks of the school year. There will be no grades or levels on the Progress Report. Students will receive either "Progressing Very Well", "Progressing Well", and/or "Progressing with Difficulty" in each subject area. The new TDSB Kindergarten Progress Report will be sent home with Kindergarten students and will present progress in three areas: Key Learnings, Growth in Learning, and Next Steps.

Parent/teacher interviews will take place on Thursday, November 16th in the evening, on Friday, November 17th in the morning, or at other mutually convenient times. Interviews will be scheduled through an on-line booking system or hard copy depending on the classroom. We look forward to seeing parents and guardians and sharing the progress of our students. We are all partners in the school's success!

## November is Indigenous Education Month

In November, we celebrate Indigenous Education Month at the TDSB. This month provides an opportunity to centre Indigenous perspectives, histories and contemporary realities across the curricula. In classrooms across the city, we focus on treaties, the legacy of residential schools, as well as the achievements and accomplishments of Indigenous peoples' in Canada.

Over the course of this month, students, staff and community members will be recognizing a number of important days to deepen knowledge and learn together about our shared history and build stronger relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada.

#### Treaties Recognition Week in Ontario – November 6-10

Treaties Recognition Week is the first full week of November every year. Treaties Recognition Week was introduced in 2016 to honour the importance of treaties and to support Ontarians in learning more about treaty rights and treaty relationships.

To mark the inaugural Treaties Recognition Week last year, the Ontario Government and Indigenous partners launched a dedicated online treaties resource library - <u>https://</u> <u>www.ontario.ca/page/treaties</u> - featuring educational guides, videos and tools developed by Indigenous organizations for teachers and students across the province. The Aboriginal Education Centre provides resources, presentations and speakers to schools throughout the TDSB.





### Sewing Program

Sewing Studio will be at Whitney on November 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> to work with our students in Grades 1 – 6. Each classroom will be working with the team to build mindfulness, confidence, and empathy. Students will be taking part in the **"Confidence – You're a Superstar"** program, which gives them an opportunity to do a hands-on project to celebrate their individuality, creativity, or personality. Each class will also have an opportunity to share and present their project to their fellow classmates. According to the Journal of Positive Psychology, participating in sewing and arts and crafts helps increase self-regulation and overall well-being. A special thank you goes out to our School Council and all of you for providing the funds to cover the cost of this unique program.
