The first snowfall of the year elicits shouts of delight from the students but also brings with it necessary reminders of schoolyard behaviour during the next few months. Please help us keep our school safe

(and dry!) by speaking with your children about:

- 1) Respecting fellow students by refraining from throwing snow/snowballs, destroying snow structures built by others, and pushing and shoving on icy and uneven ground
- 2) Wearing boots during recess and lunch and keeping indoor shoes for inside. Wearing indoor shoes outside increases the risk of slipping on ice while also creating the indoor hazard of puddles in the classrooms and the gym
- **3)** Wearing appropriate layers, including coats, hats, and gloves. This is NOT the season for shorts and runners. Colds and flu spread quickly through the school population.
- **4)** Rules for sliding include: feet first, sitting up, one at a time, checking the way is clear before sliding, and SNOW PANTS are a must.

On Tuesday, November 18, we hosted the second Whitney School Council - General Council Meeting of this year. We discussed a wide range of topics, including the safety concerns raised by traffic congestion and illegal parking around Whitney during drop-off and pick-up. In terms of the parking issue, a committee is being (re)formed, which Andy Filipiuk has agreed to chair. Please contact us at the email below to join the Parking Committee. Lots of good ideas are surfacing. The Council also shared updates on holiday charities, choir, lunch & after four programs, Annual Give and the playground.



Debbie provided her Principal's report and updated us on Whitney's School Improvement Plan and other matters. She also let us know that our longstanding and beloved music teacher, Gini Gray, will be retiring at the end of December. Gini will be missed! Fortunately, we will see Gini before she retires as she is returning to Whitney at the beginning of December and will be joining us for the holiday concert.

On the financial side, the iPads, protective cases and charging cart that were approved at the September spending vote have been purchased. We spent \$6,200 as compared to the \$7,350 approved as we were able to source a charging cart and protective cases that met our specifications at better price points. The computers that were approved at the February spending vote also have been purchased. We were able to stretch our dollars here too, and spent \$2,700 (for 11 computers) as compared to the \$3,100 (for 7 computers) that was approved.

Last, but not least, we discussed volunteer needs. We currently need volunteers for the parking committee, the library and the art room. We also need a volunteer corporate lawyer who is familiar with letters patent for charitable entities. Please contact us to lend a helping hand.


